PREFACE

This report is the undertaking of the Statistical Analysis Center (SAC), a component of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center. SAC is responsible for analyzing and disseminating criminal justice statistics.

The *1978 Crime in Alabama* report is intended to inform law enforcement officials and private citizens of criminal and law enforcement activity in Alabama; these data are then used for analyzing crime problems inherent in the criminal justice system and as a foundation for planning and budgeting.

Geographic areas covered in this report include the State of Alabama, Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA's) and city strata. A 1978 Crime by County report is contained in Appendix 1.

SAC would like to extend its appreciation to the Uniform Crime Reporting Section of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center for the data used in this report. Thanks are also due to law enforcement agencies - sheriffs' departments, municipal police departments, and campus police - for their cooperation in the UCR program.

INTRODUCTION

In October of 1975, Act 872 passed both houses of the Alabama Legislature creating and establishing the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC) which is commissioned to collect, store, retrieve, analyze, and disseminate criminal justice data. Inherent in ACJIC is a "uniform crime reporting system for the periodic collection and analysis of crimes reported to any and all criminal justice agencies within the state." (Act 872, § 9, 1975.)

As a result of Act 872, 1976 was the first year that mandatory reporting was required of law enforcement agencies in Alabama; prior to 1976, law enforcement agencies participated in the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting System on a voluntary basis. Mandatory reporting has resulted in a 185% increase in reporting over 1975.

Under the mandate of enabling legislation and the aegis of the FBI, the Alabama UCR program was established. The FBI plays a major role in the development of individual state's UCR programs and maintains a supervisory role in the program's activities by imposing standards for participation. There are many reasons for a state's participation in the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting program with the three most important reasons being:

1. The individual state's reporting forms contain the same form-content as that used by the FBI which allows for a uniform data collection device producing a precise indication of reported crimes in the state and subsequently in the nation;
2. Forms utilized are such that quality control procedures must be developed and this aspect of UCR produces a more accurate picture of crime and provides for more viable crime statistics; and,
3. In the area of planning and budgeting, an accurate indication of crime and crime trends places proper perspective on resource and manpower allocations.

Alabama's law enforcement agencies are supplied with monthly UCR forms. Technical Assistance field staff are made available to the reporting agencies to help answer any questions which may arise regarding forms, crime classifications and clearance data. The Technical Assistants are also responsible for training law enforcement personnel and maintaining the quality of information for output to the criminal justice system.

When the UCR summaries are returned to ACJIC, they are reviewed for accuracy by the quality control section of UCR. If questions arise, due to a lack of information or a possible error, telephone inquiries are made to the agency submitting the report.

Alabama's UCR program then furnishes the FBI with monthly data for their verification and review process. These monthly inputs are the end result of a concerted effort of the various sections of the UCR program.

CRIME & ARREST DATA

Studying criminal activity is one of the best ways to combat crime. Valid crime data can provide a solid foundation for statistical analyses, management-oriented analyses and crime breakdowns leading to the development of such projects as LOCUS, DIME, NICHOL, etc. These projects and other management-oriented projects aid local police departments in laying out patrol districts, assigning patrol units, and designing community education programs.

Data used in this report is provided by the Uniform Crime Reporting Section of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center. In 1978, a total of 362 agencies participated in Alabama's UCR program, 67 county sheriff departments and 295 local police departments.

Crime data are obtained from the Part I Index of Offenses submitted by law enforcement agencies to Alabama's UCR program. Part I Offenses are divided into Violent Crimes and Property Crimes.

Violent Crimes include Homicide, Rape, Robbery, and Assault. These crimes are considered violent inasmuch as they are offenses perpetrated against a person (or persons) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim.

Property Crimes are comprised of Burglary, Larceny, and Motor Vehicle Theft. Property or Non-Violent Crimes lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s).

Clearance and arrest data are also reported to Alabama's UCR. A crime is considered cleared when enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody. It is conceivable that one arrest could clear more than one offense or that several arrests could clear one offense. A crime may also be cleared by exceptional means in which a solution to a crime is found without formal charges being brought against a suspect. The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of clearances over the number of crimes reported.

This report is a composite picture of criminal and law enforcement activity in Alabama for 1978. It provides a breakdown for the State, the State's seven Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA's) and localities participating in the UCR program. The report concentrates on the seven Index Crimes of the FBI's Part I offenses and offers tabular and narrative formats for comparisons, trends, rates, and percentage changes.

TOTAL INDEX CRIME

Total Index Crime is comprised of the seven Part I Offenses: Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Assault, Burglary, Larceny, and Motor Vehicle Theft. Both crime and arrest data are collected for Part I Index Crimes.

* * * * *

In 1978 the Total Index Crime reached 146,154 cases; this is a 7% increase over 1977 figures. The crime rate for Alabama also increased 7% from 3954.3 crimes per 100,000 people in 1977 to 4221.9 incidents per 100,000 in 1978.

Of the Total Index Crimes reported to law enforcement agencies in 1978, 11% of those reported were considered Violent crimes with 89% being Property crimes. The Property crimes of Burglary and Motor Vehicle Theft showed the greatest increase over 1977, 9% for both categories. Larceny and Homicide both increased by 6% in 1978. Assault experienced the smallest increase, 1%. In 1977, reported Rape experienced the sharpest increase of any Part I Offense, 19%; in 1978 reported Rape showed a 2% increase with an absolute difference of 22 cases.

There were 28,029 arrests for Part I Offenses in 1978 effecting a clearance rate of 19%. Twenty-four per cent of the arrests cleared Violent crimes and 76% cleared Property crimes.

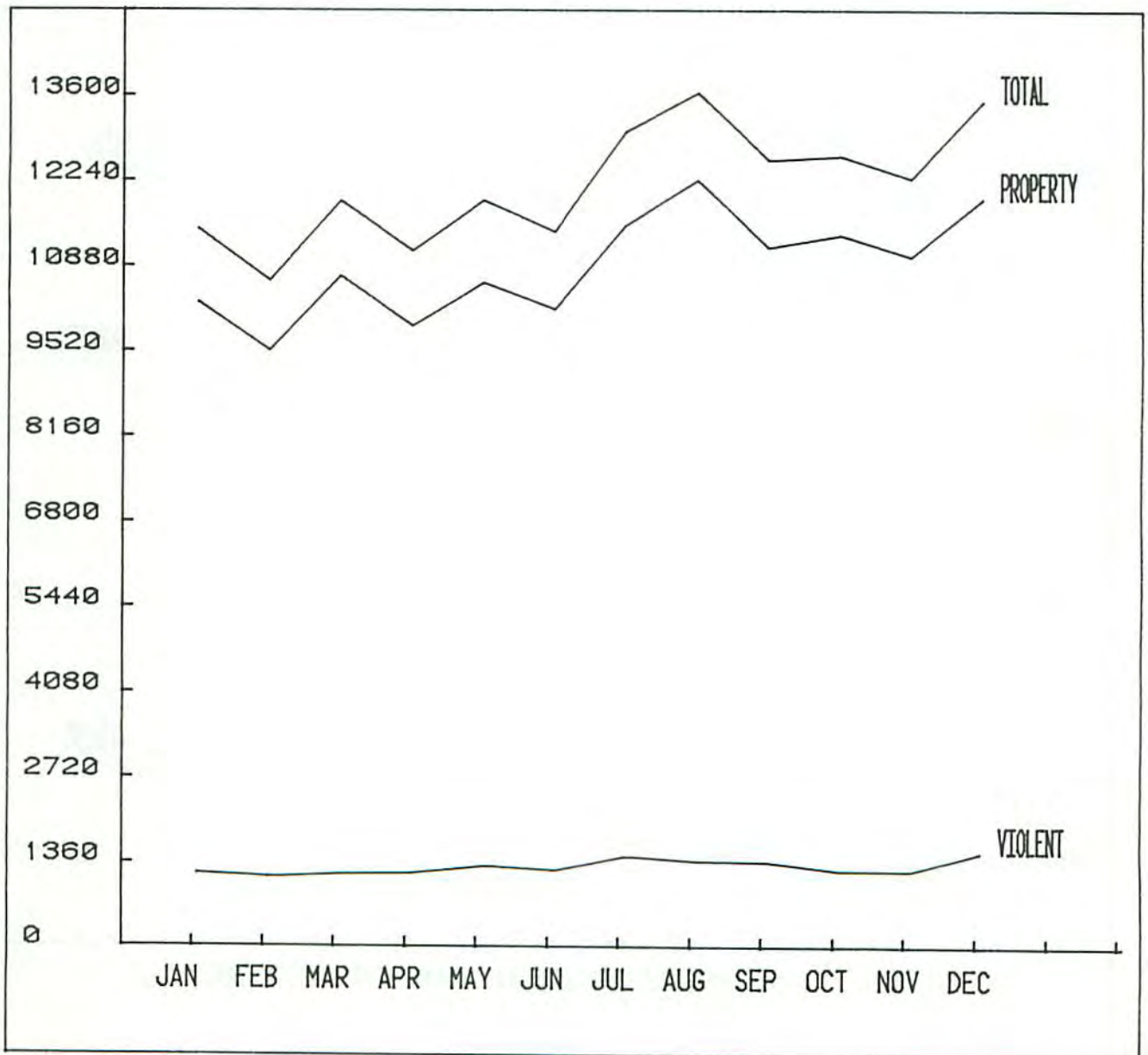
Twenty-nine per cent of the Part I clearances were juvenile arrests with Larceny arrests making up 15% of that total.

Males effected 79% of the Part I arrests and females, 21%. Whites accounted for 47% of the clearances and blacks accounted for 53%.

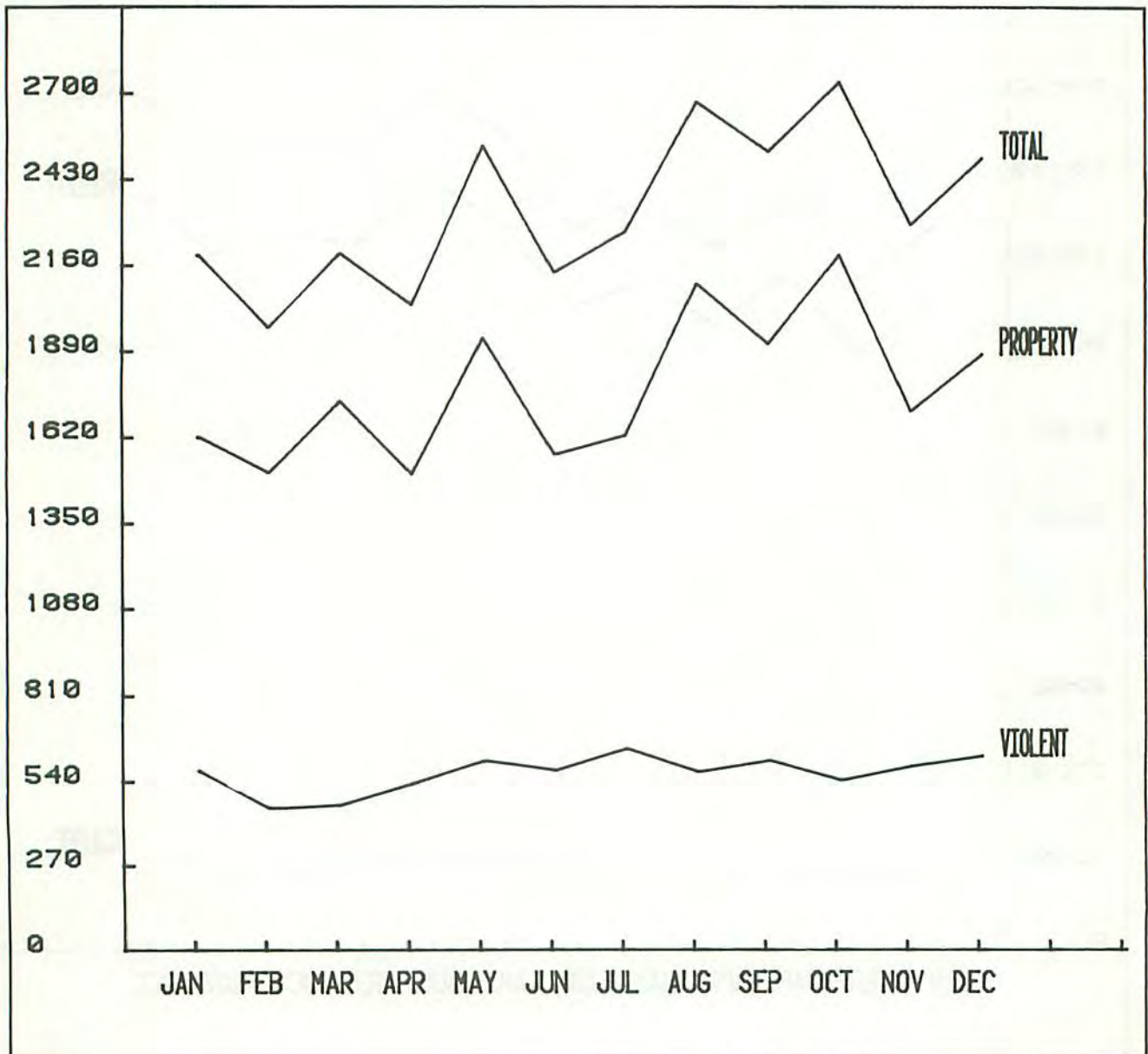

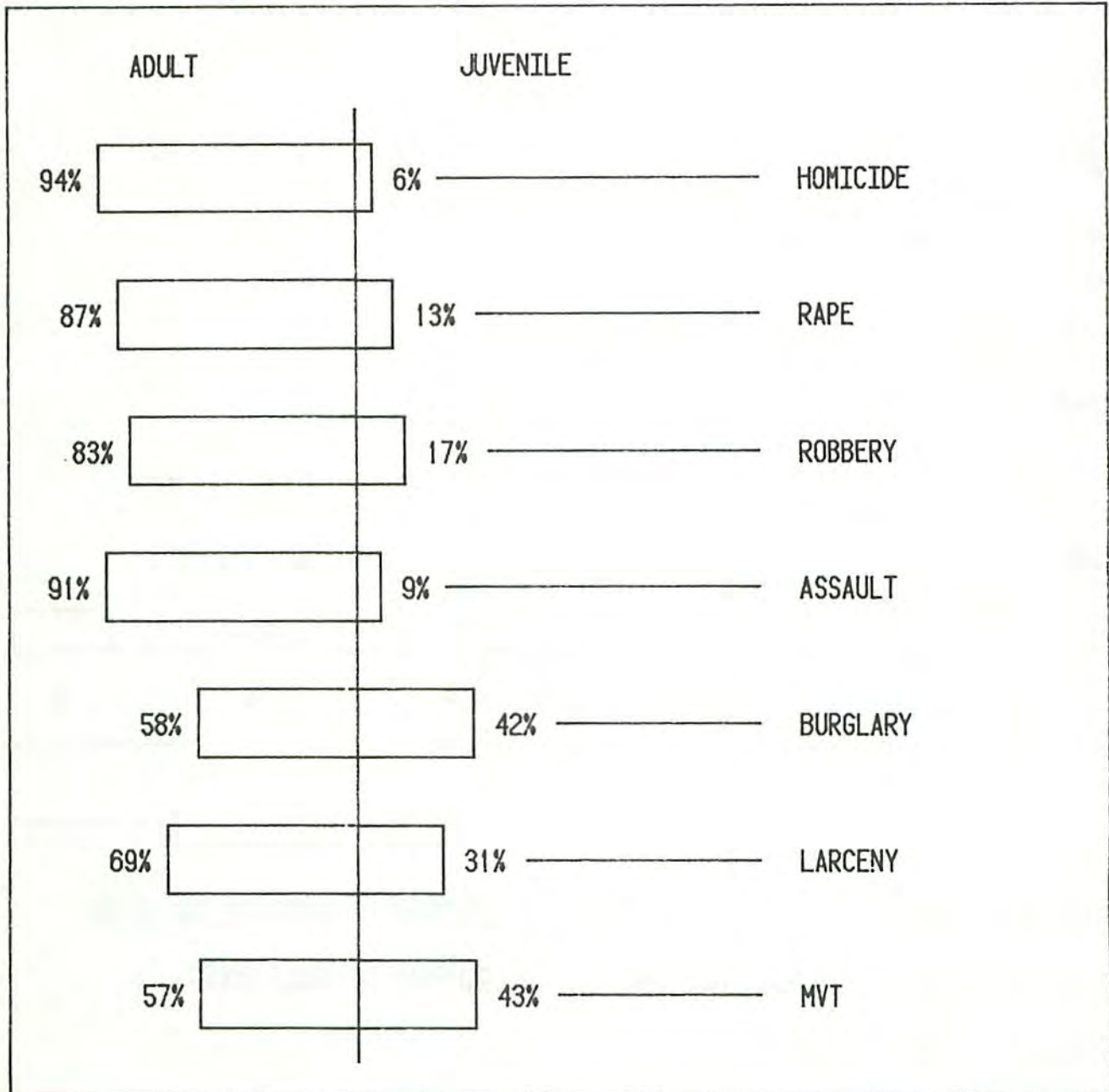

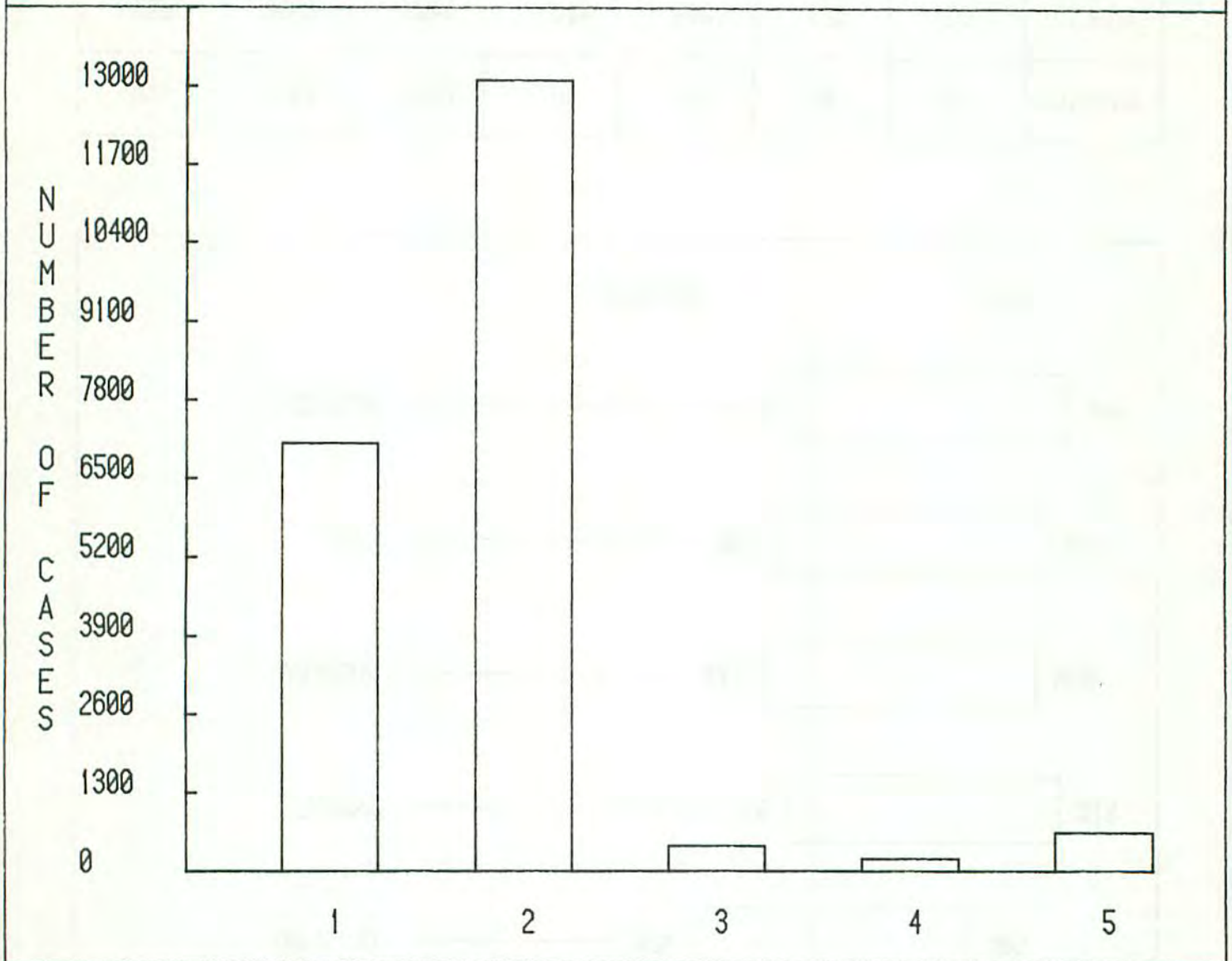


ADULT - JUVENILE PROPORTIONS OF ARREST

PROPERTY CRIME

Property Crime is comprised of Burglary, Larceny, and Motor Vehicle Theft. These crimes are designated as Property Crimes because they lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s).

* * * * *

In 1978, a total of 130,687 Property Crimes were reported to law enforcement agencies. This is a 7% increase over Property Crimes reported in 1977. The 1978 reported Property Crimes comprised 89% of the Total Part I Offenses.

Burglary and Motor Vehicle Theft both experienced a 9% increase over 1977's reported offenses. Larceny showed a 6% increase in reported incidents.

The Property Crime rate increased by 7% in 1978 from 3514.7 incidents per 100,000 people in 1977 to 3775.1 incidents in 1978.

There were 21,266 arrests for Property Crime in 1978 effecting a 16% clearance rate. The Property Crime clearances comprised 76% of the total number of Part I arrests with juveniles accounting for 35% of the Property Crime clearances and juveniles arrested for Property Crimes accounted for 26% of the Total Part I arrests.

Males accounted for 76% of the Property Crime arrests and females, 24%. Whites comprised 49% of the Property Crime clearances and blacks accounted for 51%.

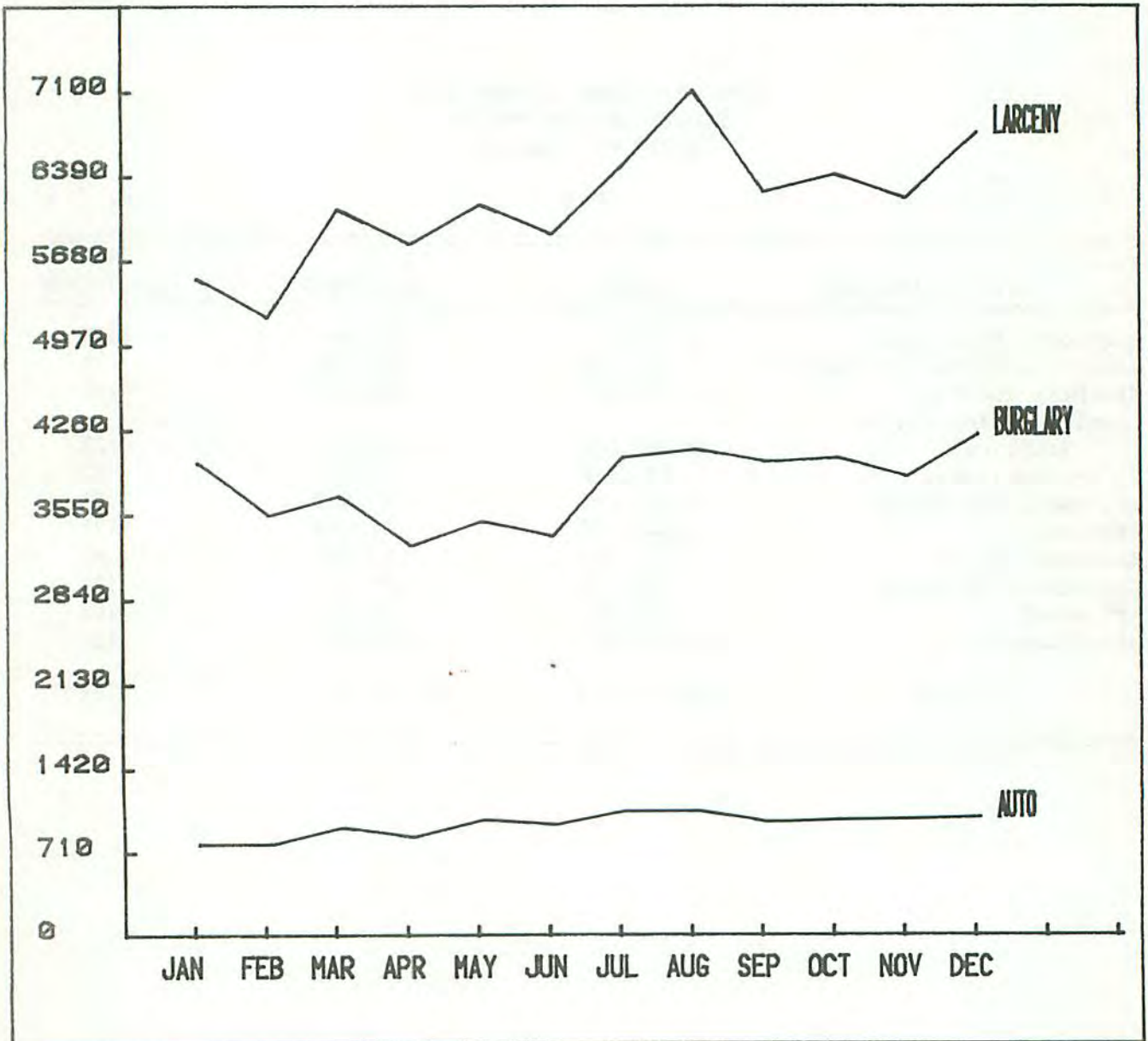

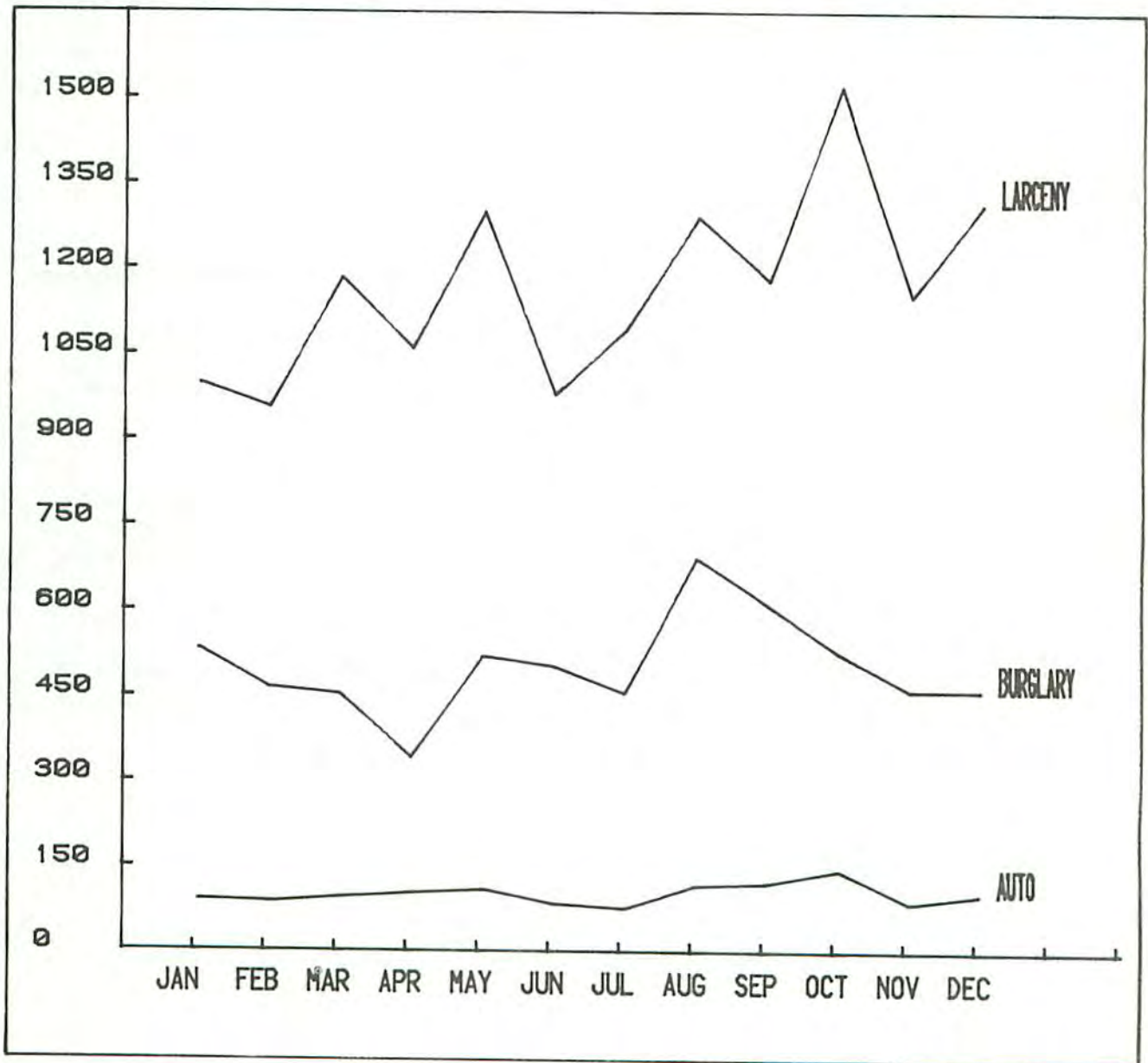

VIOLENT CRIME

Violent Crime is comprised of Homicide, Rape, Robbery, and Assault.

These crimes are designated as Violent Crimes because they are offenses perpetrated against a person (or persons) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim.

* * * * *

In 1978, there were a total of 15,467 offenses designated as Violent Crimes reported to law enforcement agencies. This is 11% of the Total Part I Offenses. Violent Crime experienced a 2% increase in 1978 over 1977.

Of the Violent Crimes reported, Homicide experienced the greatest increase, 6% with Assault effecting the smallest increase, 1%. Reported Robbery increased by 3% and reported rape, 2%.

The Violent Crime rate increased by 2% in 1978 from 439.6 incidents per 100,000 people in 1977 to 446.8 in 1978.

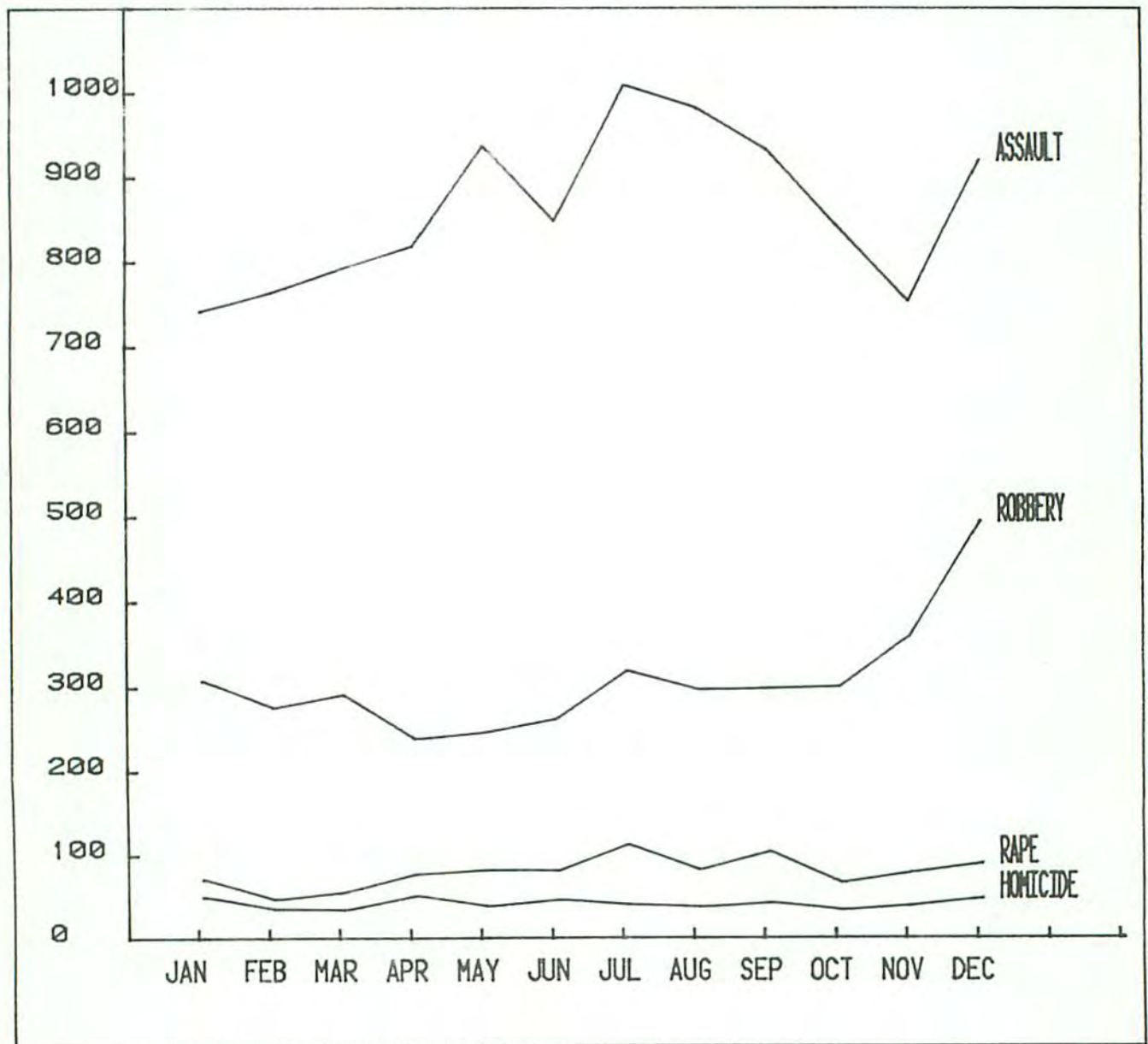
There were 6,709 arrests for Violent Crime in 1978 producing a clearance rate of 43%. The Violent Crime clearances comprised 24% of the total number of Part I arrests with juveniles accounting for 10% of the Violent Crime arrests.

Males accounted for 89% of the Violent Crime arrests and females, 11%. Blacks accounted for 57% of the Violent Crime clearances and whites made up 43% of the arrests for Violent Crime.

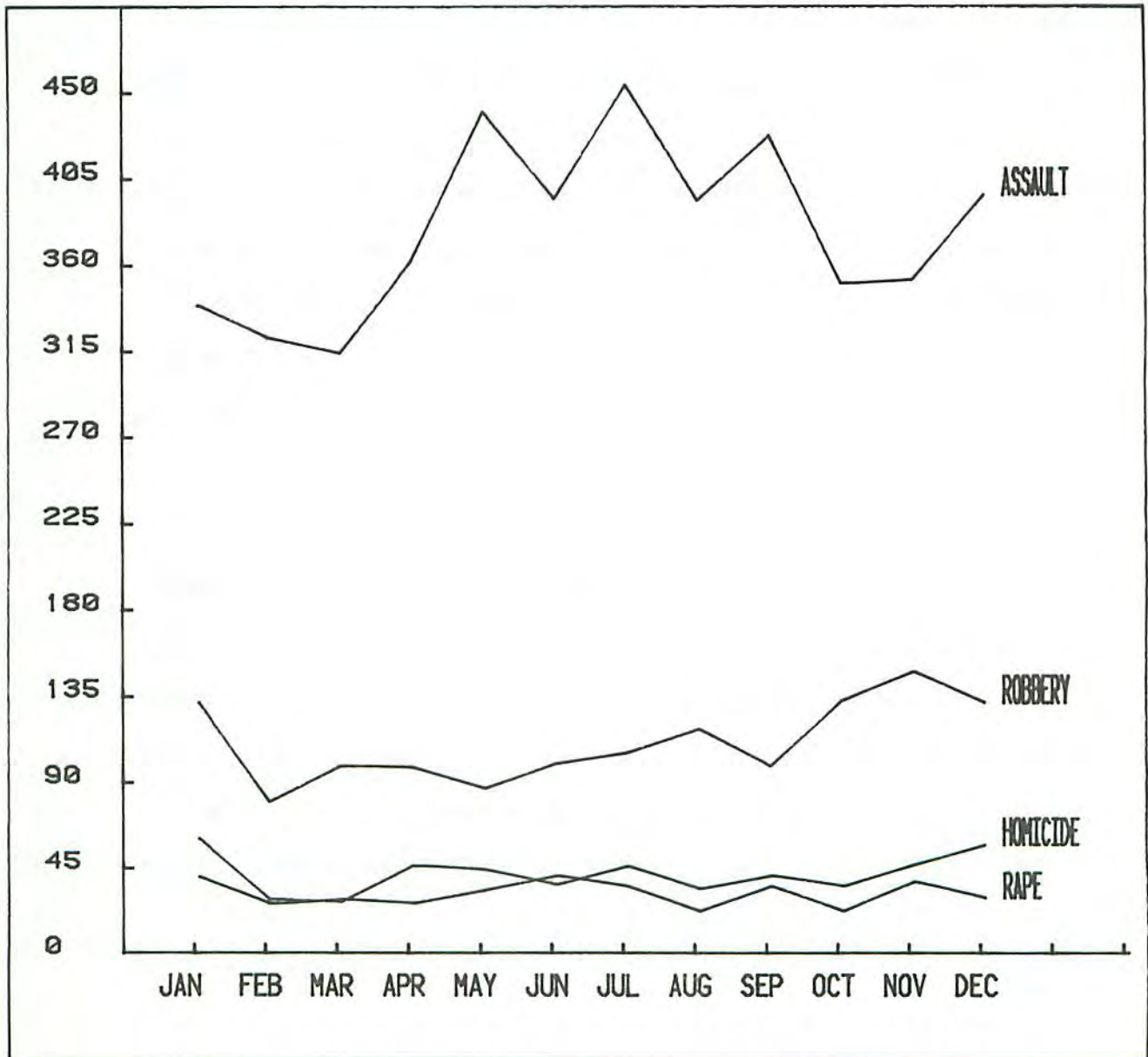

HOMICIDE

Homicide - the willful killing of another as based on police investigation.

* * * * *

In 1978, 493 homicides were reported to Alabama law enforcement agencies. This is a 6% decrease over 1977's homicide incidence of 525. Homicide incidents comprise .3% of the total index crime and 3% of the Violent Crime.

The homicide rate (per 100,000 residents) decreased by 8% over 1977 going from 14.4 to 13.2 murders per 100,000 people.

There were 461 clearances for homicide in 1978 for a clearance rate of 94%. Homicide clearances made up 2% of the total number of clearances for 1978 and 7% of the clearances for Violent Crime.

The 25-29 age category accounted for 75 arrests or 16% of the total arrests for homicide, followed by the 30-34 age group with 53 arrests or 11% of the total homicide clearances.

Males accounted for 381 of the homicide clearances or 83%. Blacks made up 63% of the total homicide arrests; whites accounted for the remaining 37%.

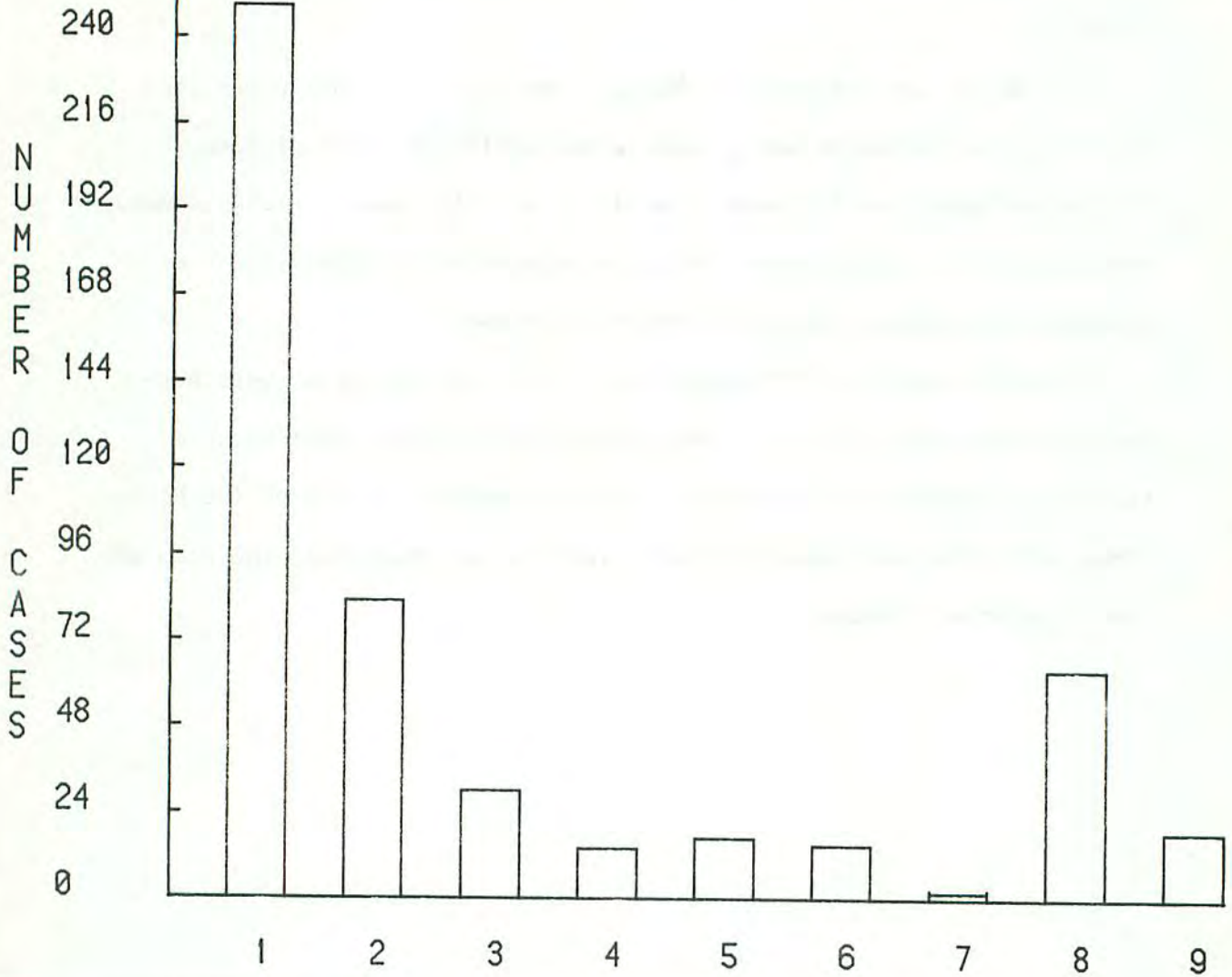
Juveniles account for 28 clearances or 6% of the total homicide clearances with 57% of the juvenile homicide clearances being 17 year olds. Male juveniles represented 79% of the juvenile homicide arrests. Black juveniles accounted for 71% of the clearances while whites made up the remaining 29%.

Data available for homicide victims in Alabama for 1978 show that 81% of those killed were males and 19% females; 40% were white and 60%, black.

In 51% of the incidents, a handgun was used. A shotgun was used in 17% of the incidents and a knife effected 13% of the homicides. Thirty homicides, or 6%, were a result of a rifle wound. Clubs, hands, and automobiles each effected 3% of the homicides in 1978. In 4% of the murders, weapons listed as "other" were used.

Offender data for 1978 shows that 76% of the homicides were perpetrated by a male, 19% by a female and in 5% of the homicides, the sex of the offender was unknown. Blacks accounted for 60% of the homicides and whites accounted for 36%. In 4% of the homicides the race of the offender was unknown.

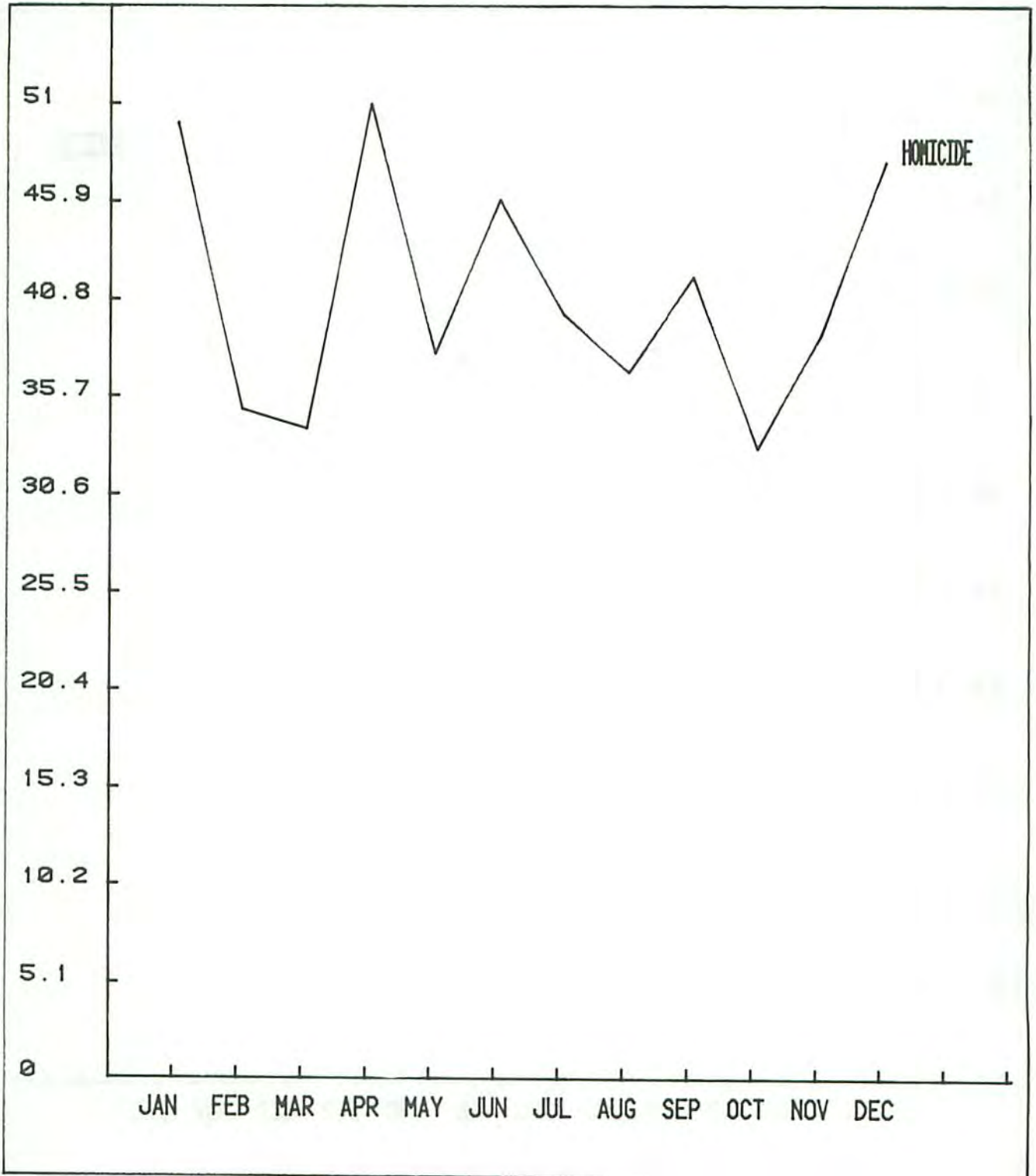

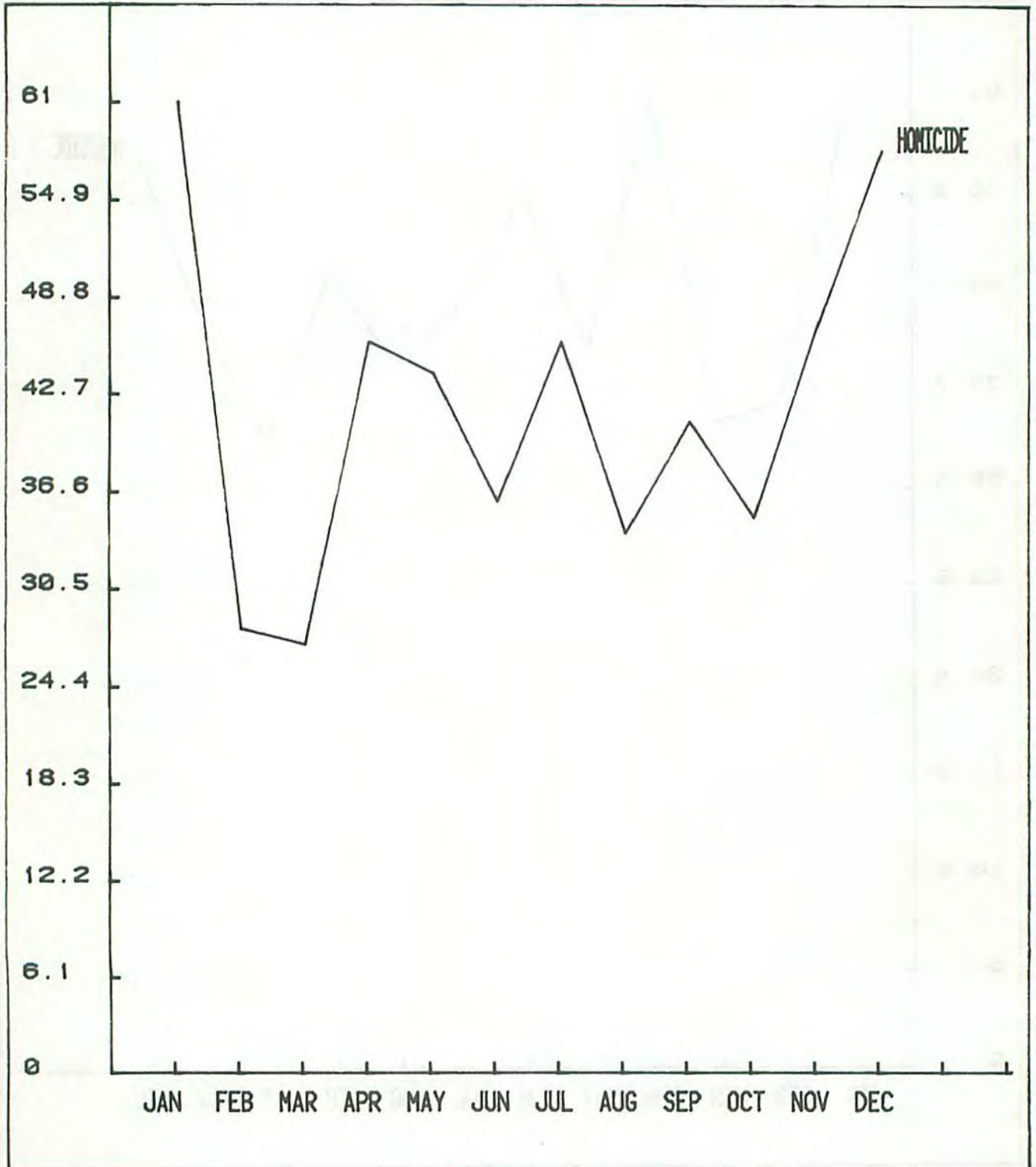

RAPE

Rape - carnal knowledge of a female through the use of force or the threat of force; includes attempts.

* * * * *

Reported rape showed a 2% increase in 1978 over 1977 figures going from 925 incidences in 1977 to 947 in 1978. Rape rate* increased by 2% over 1977 increasing from 47.5 rapes per 100,000 people to 48.7 in 1978. Reported rape made up 1% of the total index crime and 6% of the Violent Crime totals.

Of the 947 reported rapes, 374 were cleared in 1978 producing a clearance rate of 39%. This is 1% of the total number of clearances and 6% of the Violent Crime clearances for the state.

The 25-29 age group accounted for 74 clearances or 20% of the rape clearances. Juveniles under 18 cleared 50 rapes or 13% of the rape clearances.

Black males represented 66% of the rape clearances with whites accounting for the remaining 34%.

Juvenile clearances for forcible rape make up 1% of the total number of juvenile clearances and 7% of the juvenile clearances for Violent Crime. Six juveniles under 15 years of age were arrested for forcible rape with the remaining 44 clearances being 15-17 years

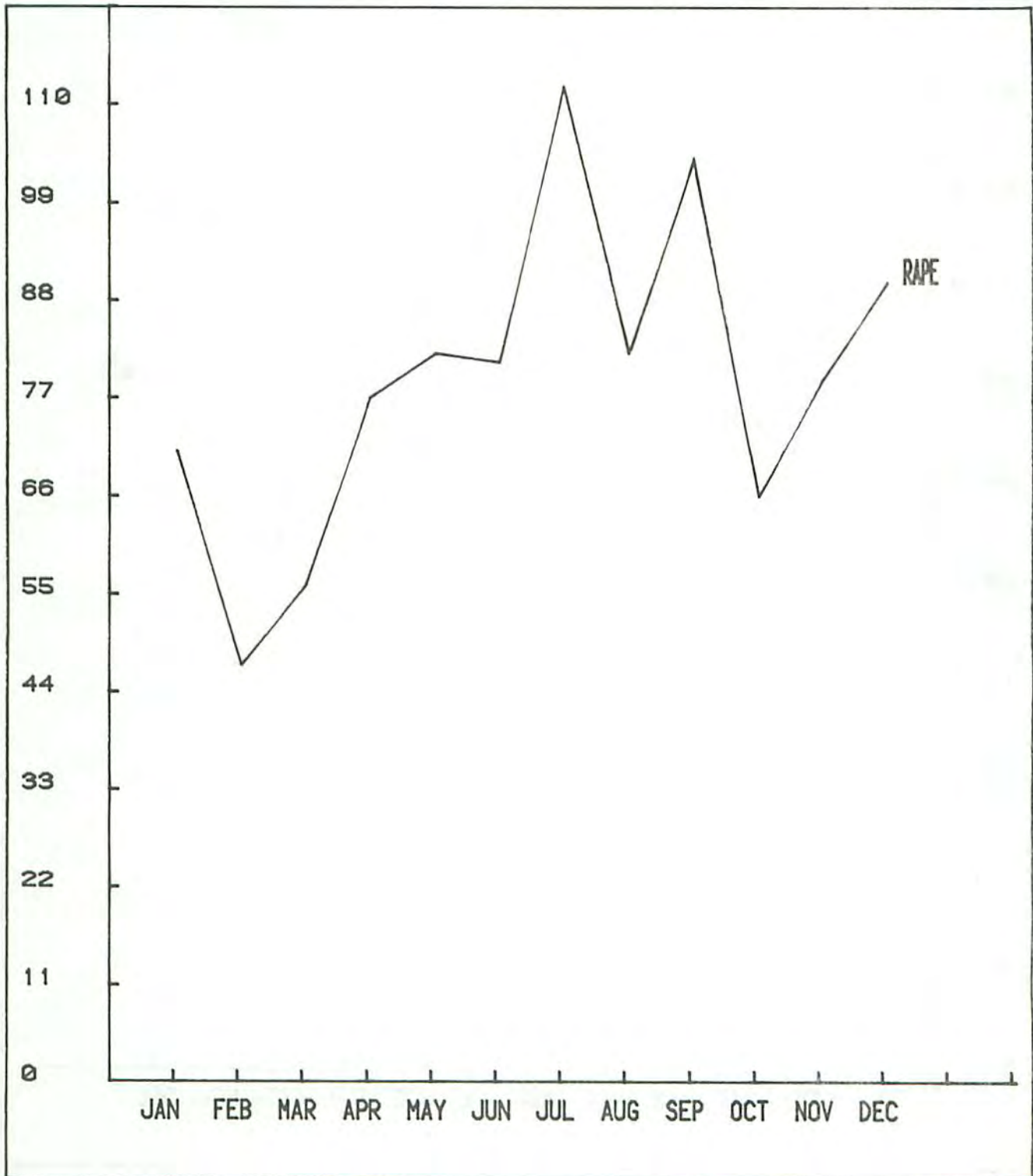
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of age. There was one clearance in the 11-12 year group, 5 clearances in the 13-14 year group. There were 8 in the 15 year category, and 16 and 20 clearances in the 16 and 17 year categories, respectively. Sixty-six per cent of the juvenile clearances for forcible rape were black males with the remaining 34%, white males.

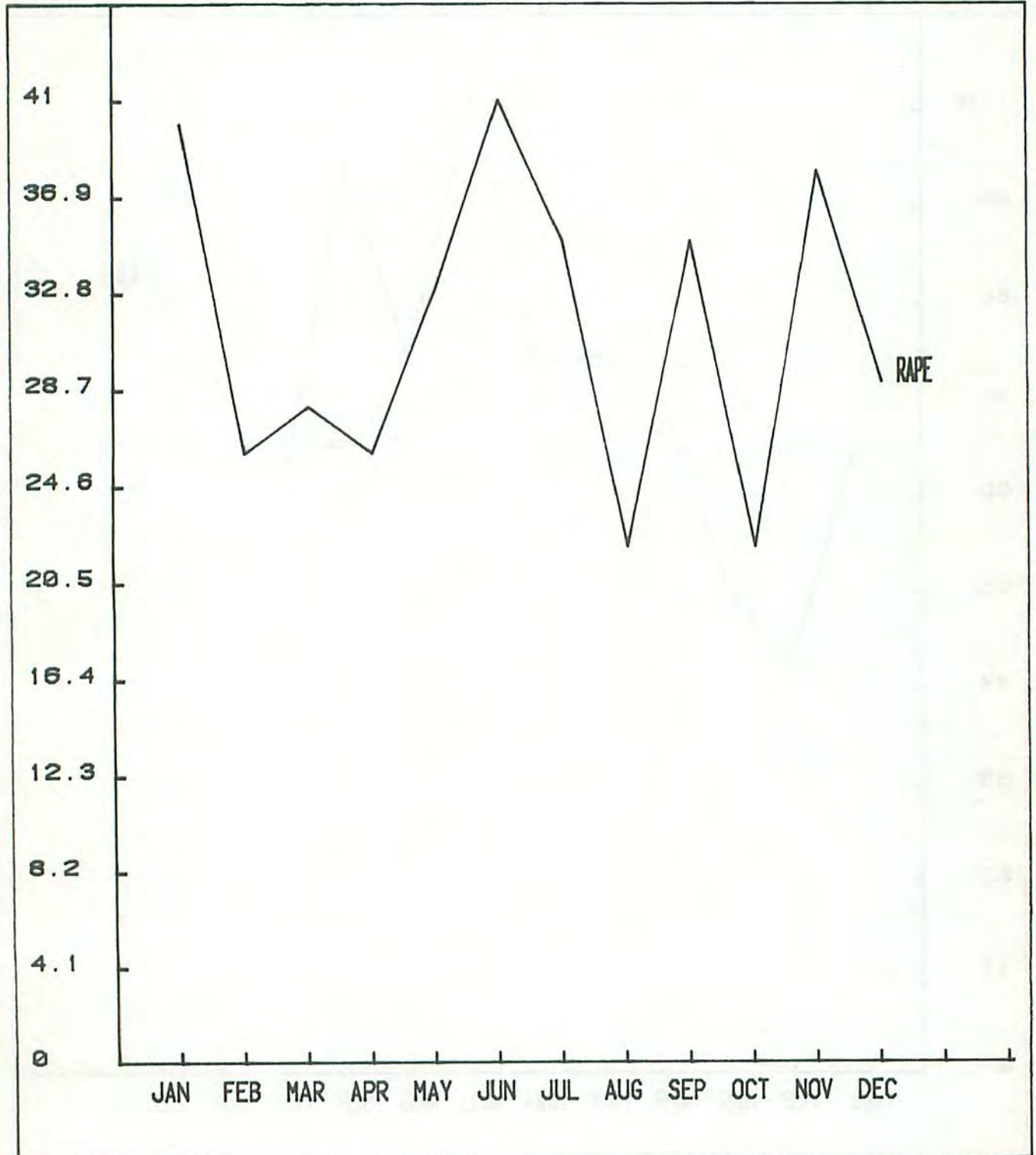

ROBBERY

Robbery - stealing or taking anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person, in his presence, by force or by threat of force; includes attempts.

* * * * *

Robbery increased by 3% in 1978 over 1977 from 3564 incidents to 3685. The robbery rate increased by 1% from 97.4 in 1977 to 98.5 in 1978.

There were 1332 robberies cleared in 1978 effecting a 36% clearance rate. Robbery clearances account for 5% of the total crime clearances and 20% of the Violent Crime clearances.

The 25-29 age group accounted for 17% of the robbery clearances with the next highest age group being 20 year olds; they accounted for 9% of the robbery clearances.

Ninety-four per cent of the robbery clearances were males. Sixty-eight per cent of the robbery clearances were blacks with the remaining 32% being whites.

Juveniles accounted for 17% of the total robbery clearances in 1978. The greatest number of clearances resulted in the 17 year age group with 100 clearances or 43% of the juvenile clearances for robbery. The fewest number of clearances were in the 11-12 year age group with 6 clearances or 3% of the juvenile robbery clearances.

Robbery is broken down into seven categories. Highway offenses occur on the streets, alleys, and in general view of police patrol. These are robberies occurring outside of structures. In 1978, 38% of robberies were scored in this category with the actual number of highway robberies being 1394. The total dollar value involved for highway robberies was \$350,557 which gave an average dollar value of \$251 per incident.

Commercial houses are listed as commercial establishments, such as hotels, motels, lodging houses, loan companies, etc. Commercial house robberies were 18% of the total number of robberies in 1978 with 648 reported incidents. The total dollar amount stolen for this category was \$347,211 for an average of \$536.

Gas or service stations are establishments whose main purpose is selling gasoline and related products. In 1978, there were 390 reported incidents involving gas or service stations for a total dollar amount of \$102,428 and an average of \$263.

Convenience stores are defined as neighborhood stores which specialize in the sale of consumable items. These stores are easily accessible and usually have extended hours of operation. Fifteen percent of the total reported robberies occurred in convenience stores. The 547 convenience store robberies resulted in \$119,296 stolen with an average dollar value of \$218.

Residential robberies are all robberies occurring in a dwelling or on the premises. There were 360 reported residential robberies in 1978 making up 10% of the reported robberies. The total dollar value involved in residential robberies was \$125,185 with an average dollar value of \$348 per incident.

Robberies involving the bank category include savings and loan institutions, credit unions, building and loan associations, etc. There were 35 robberies pertaining to banking institutions that were reported to law enforcement officials in 1978. This is 1% of the total reported robberies in Alabama. The total dollar amounts for bank related robberies was \$184,890 with \$5,283 being the average amount stolen per incident.

The miscellaneous category includes, churches, temples, schools, union halls, government buildings, public transit systems, offices, etc. Eight per cent of the reported robberies are listed in this category. There were 311 actual cases reported for a total dollar value of \$69,241. This produces an average of \$223 per incident.

Robbery is classified as a Violent Crime due to the possibility of injury or death to the victim(s). In 58% of the reported robberies, a firearm was used to effect the crime. Of robberies involving firearms, 36% were cleared with 3% being cleared by juveniles. A knife or cutting instrument was used in 11% of the reported robberies; of these robberies, 38% were cleared with 6% being juvenile clearances. Other dangerous weapons effected 5% of the reported robberies; 40% of these

were cleared with 3% being cleared by juvenile arrests. Strong-arm robberies resulted in 26% of the reported robberies; 39% of these strong-arm robberies were cleared with 5% being cleared by juvenile arrests.

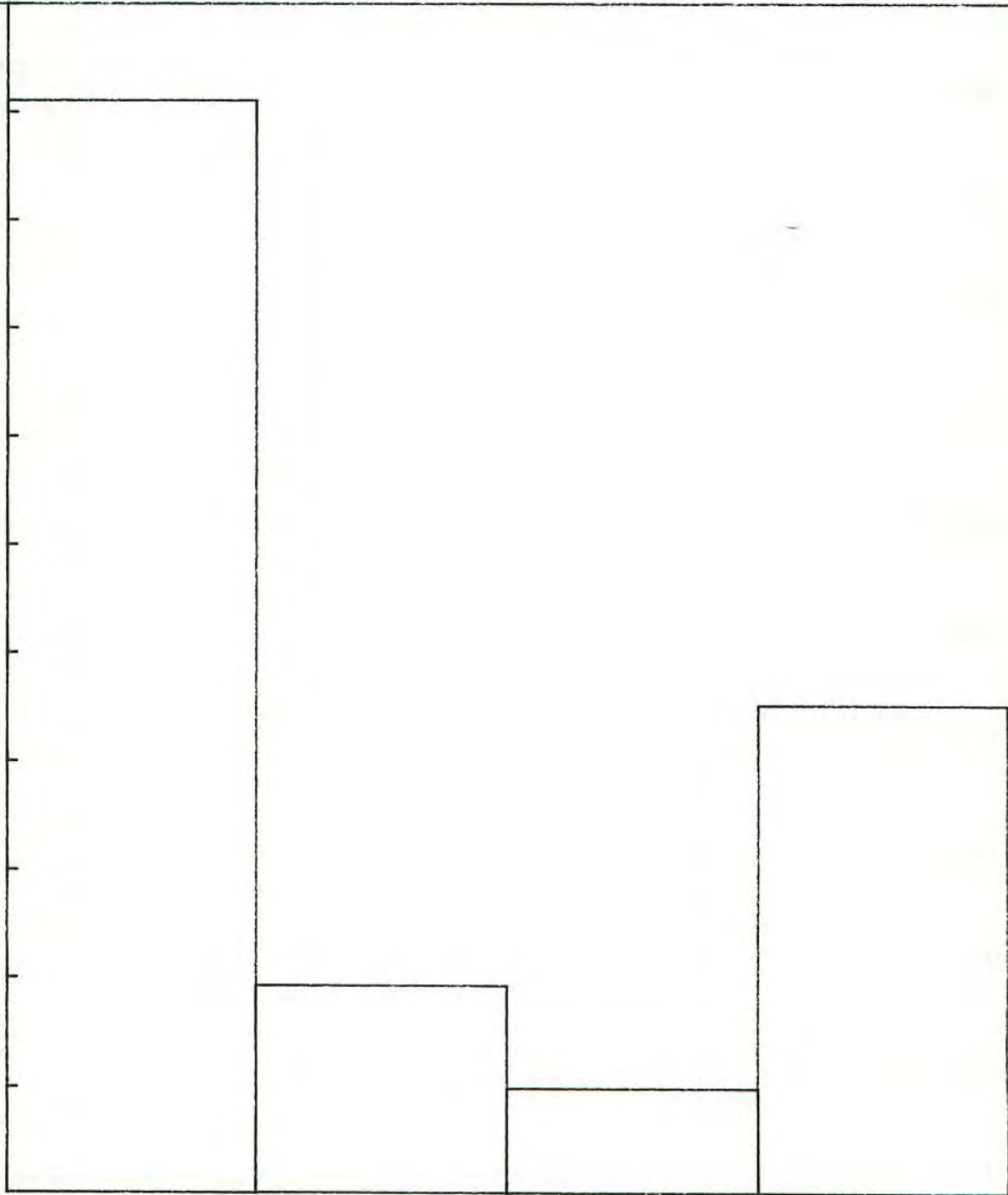

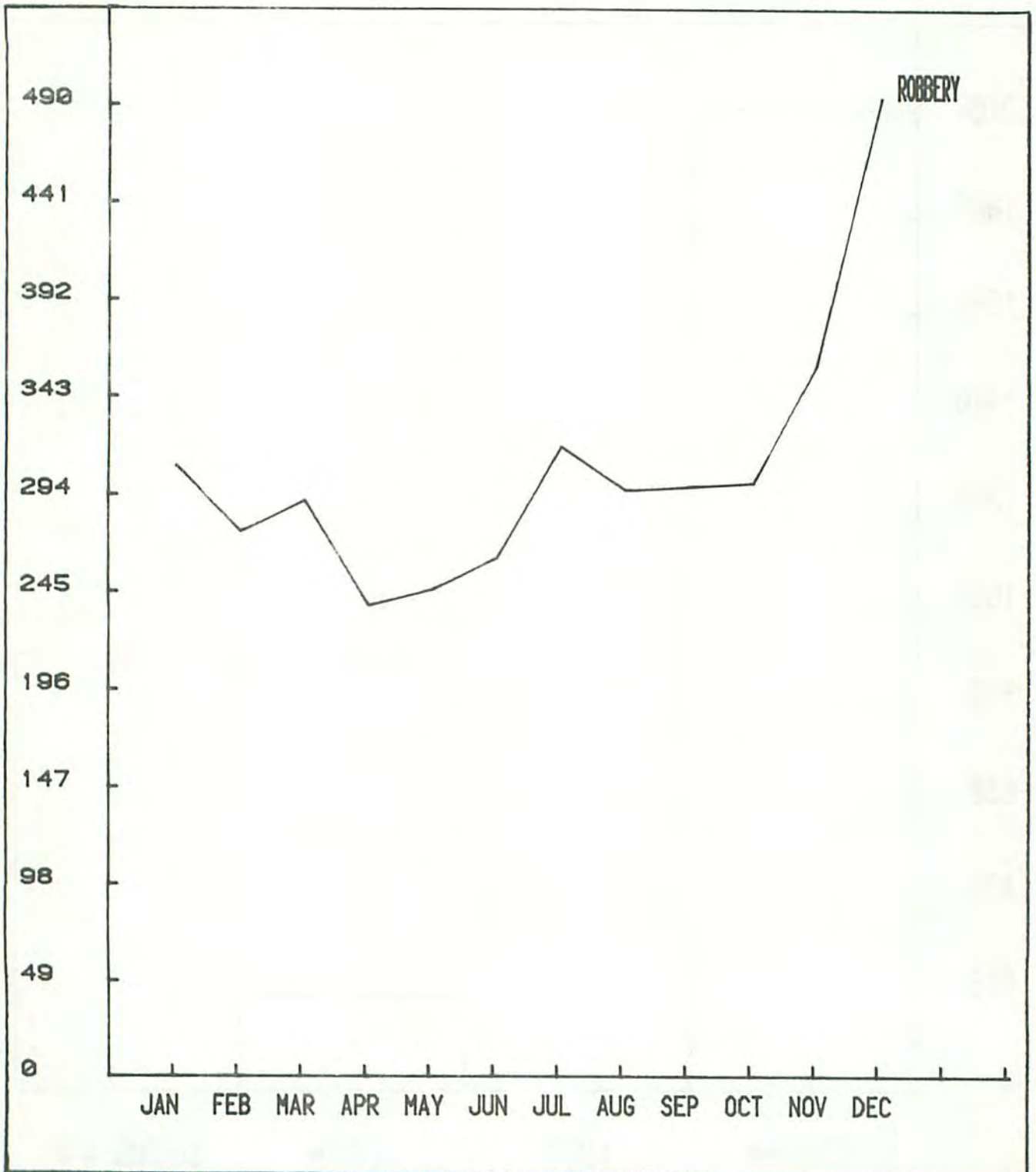

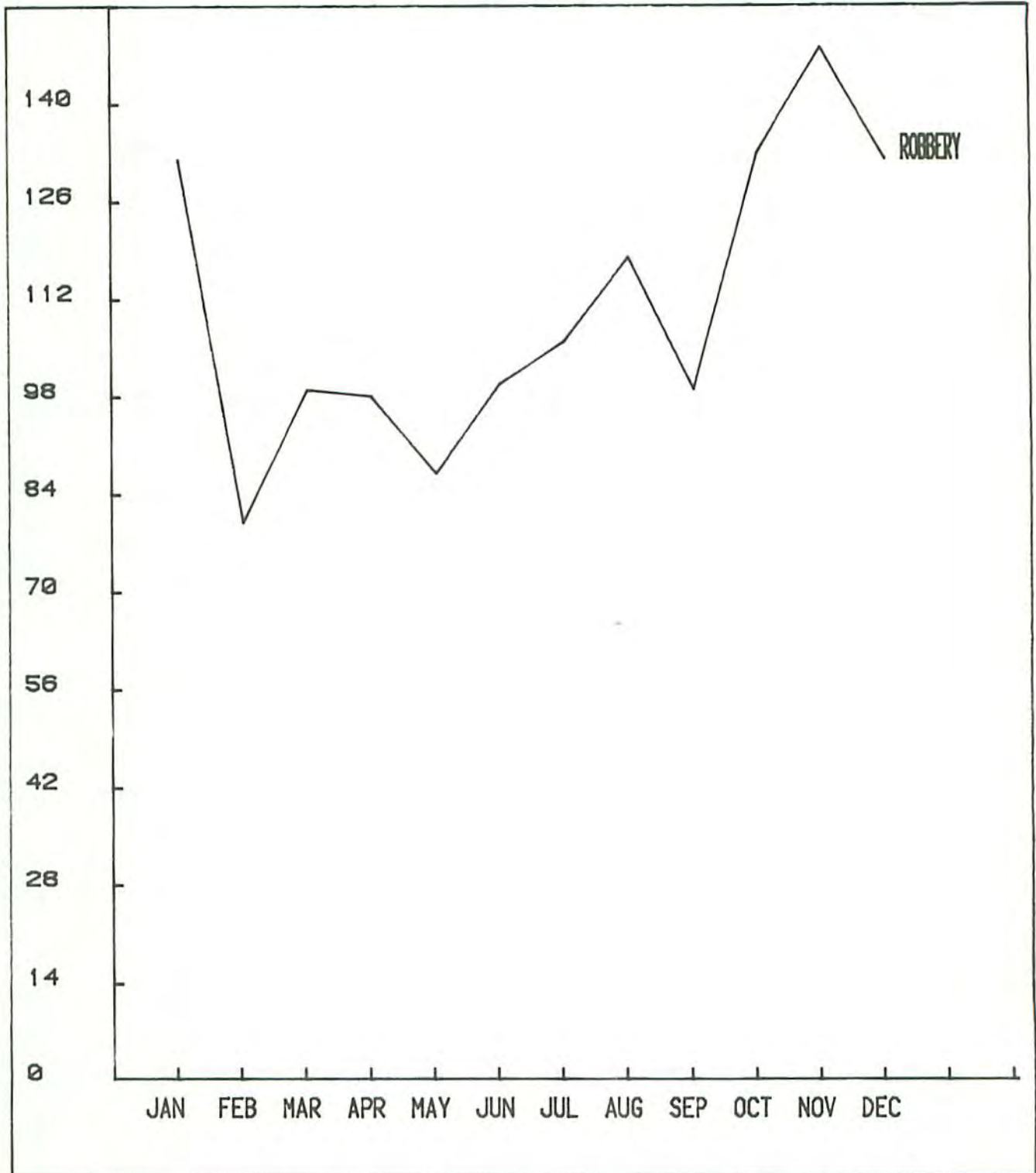

ASSAULT

Assault - the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury; includes attempts.

* * * * *

There were 10,342 reported assaults in 1978, a 1% increase over 1977. The assault rate remained relatively consistent. For 1978 it was 2762 assaults per 100,000 people.

A total of 4542 assaults were cleared in 1978 producing a 44% clearance rate. Assault clearances make up 16% of the total number of clearances and 68% of the Violent Crime clearances. Those persons arrested between the ages of 25 and 39 make up 40% of the assault clearances with the 25-29 age group representing the greatest number of clearances 813 or 18% followed by 30-34 with 597 or 13%, and 35-39 with 420 or 9%.

Eighty-seven per cent of those arrested for aggravated assault were males. Forty-eight per cent of the clearances for assault were whites and 52%, black.

Juveniles accounted for 387 assault clearances, 35% of which were under 15 years, 65% were between 15 and 17 years of age. The greatest number of juvenile clearances for assault were in the 17 year age bracket with 104 arrests or 27% of the total juvenile clearances. Next was the 16 year old group with 90 clearances or 23% of the total

juvenile clearances for assault. The age group 10 and under accounted for the fewest number of clearances, 21 or 5%, of the total juvenile clearances for assault.

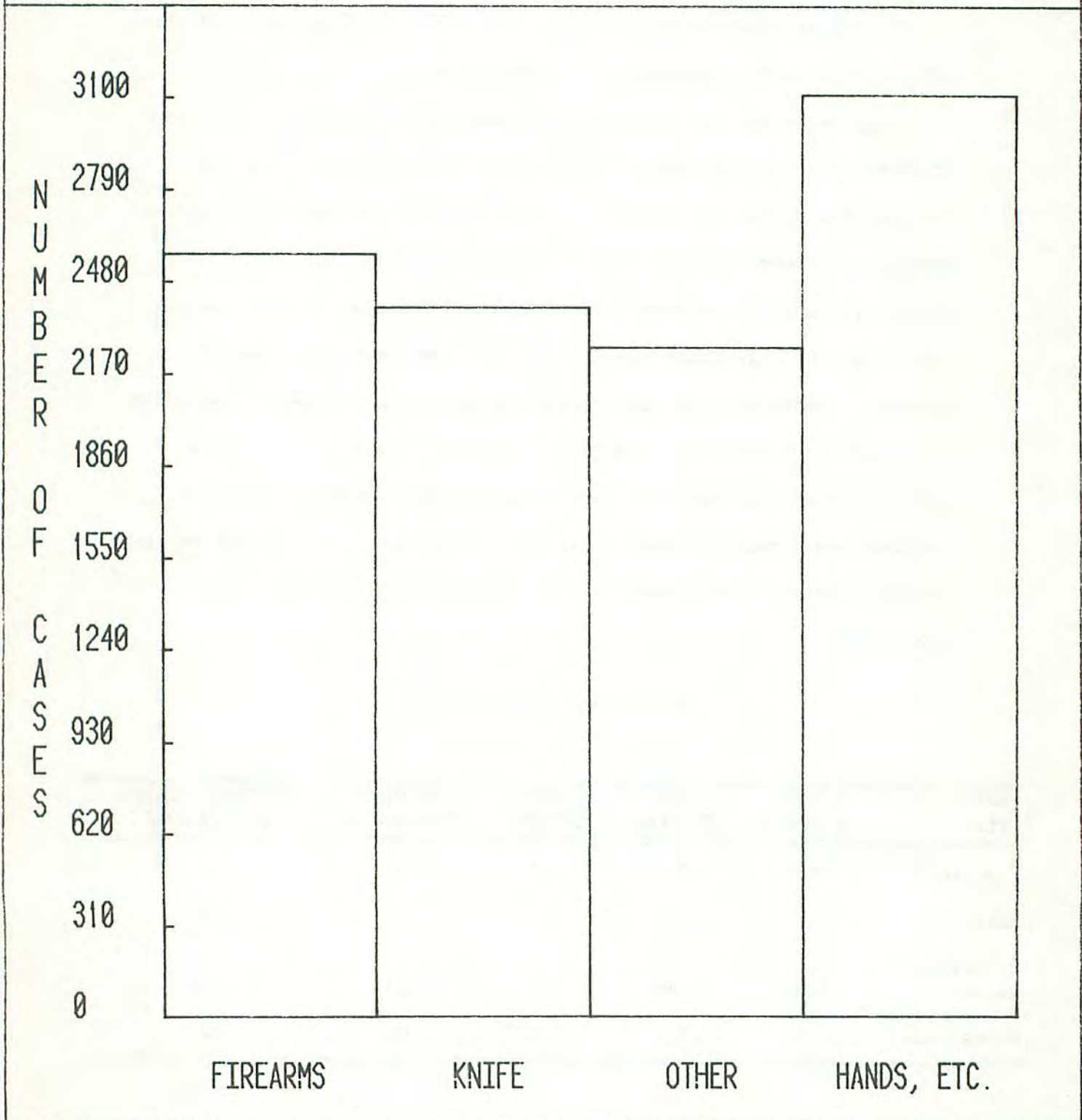
For these juvenile related clearances, 80% of those arrested were males. On a racial breakdown, 40% were white and 60% were black.

Aggravated assault is usually accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. In 25% of the reported aggravated assault incidents, a firearm was used, of these assaults, 70% were cleared with 2% being cleared by juvenile arrests. A knife or cutting instrument resulted in 23% of the reported assaults effecting a 63% clearance rate; 3% of the clearances were juvenile arrests. Twenty-two per cent of the reported assaults were a result of other dangerous weapons; this category has a clearance rate of 66% with a 6% juvenile clearance rate. Aggravated assaults in which the assailant used hands, fists, feet, etc., resulted in 30% of the reported assaults; 69% of these assaults were cleared; the juvenile clearance rate was 4%.

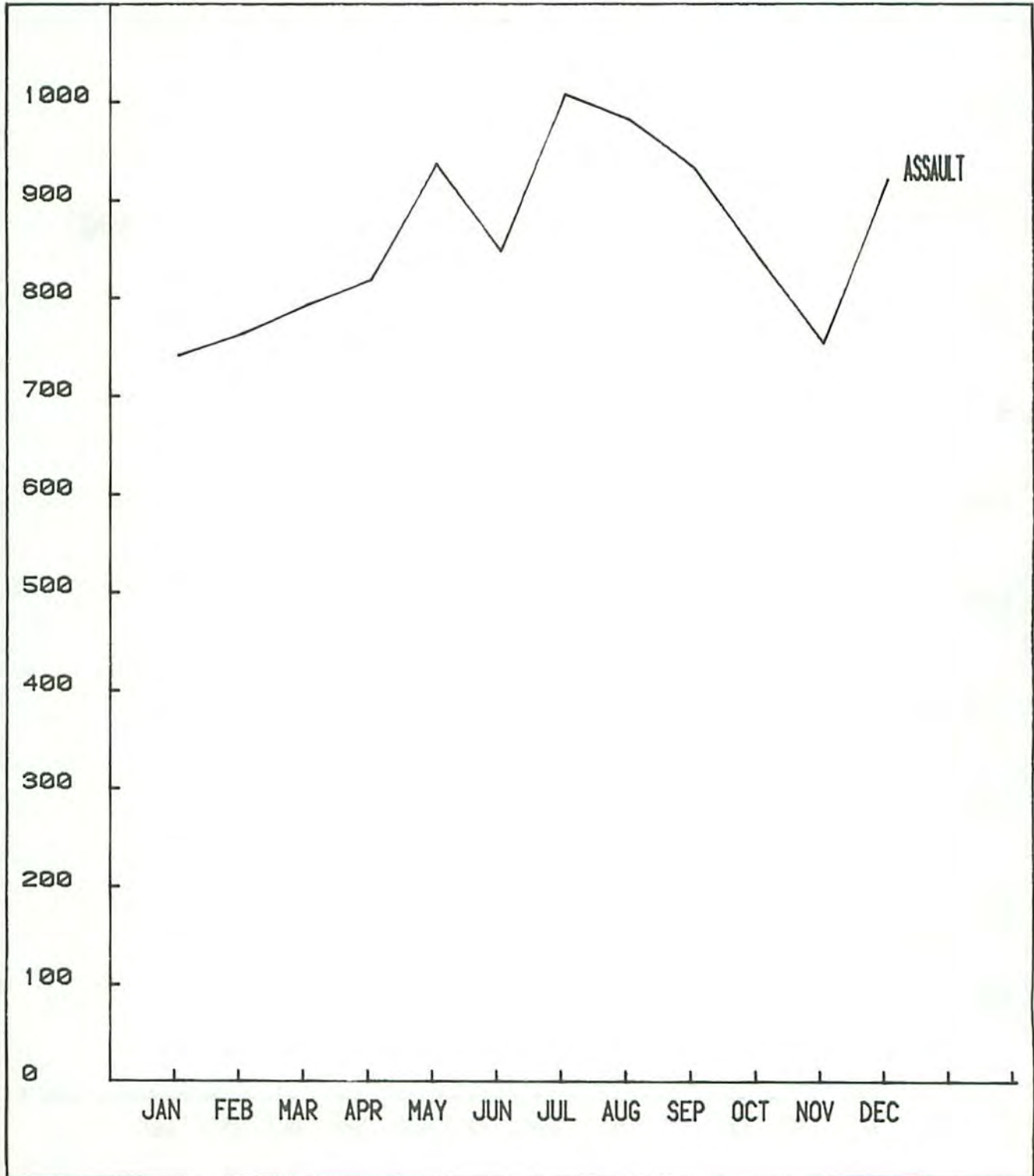
ASSAULT BY WEAPON TYPE

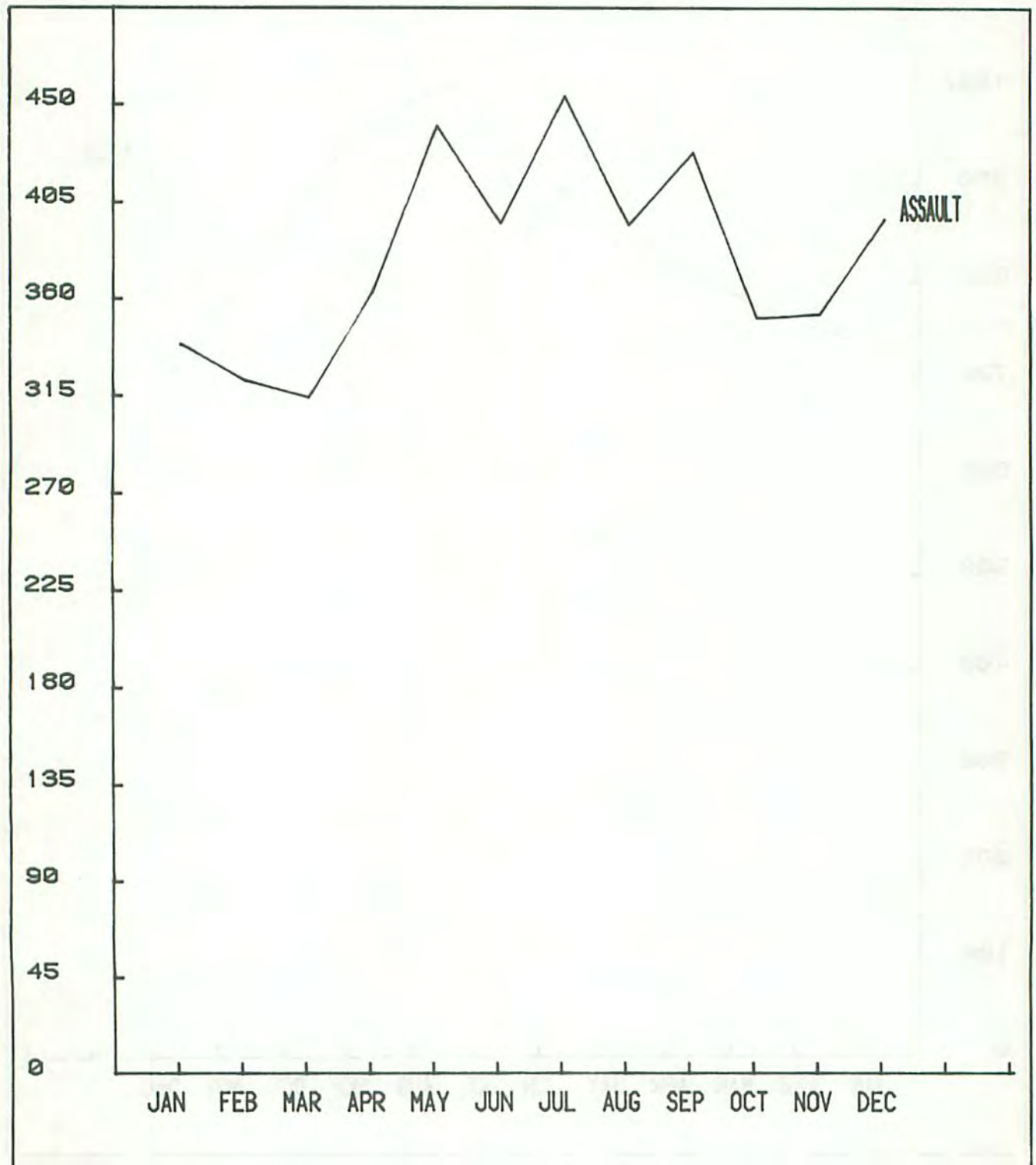

BURGLARY

Burglary - unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. Includes forcible entry, unlawful entry and attempted forcible entry.

* * * * *

Reported burglaries increased by 9% in 1978 over the previous year. There were 45,566 burglaries reported in 1978 compared to 41,769 for 1977. The burglary rate, likewise, experienced an increase, rising from 1141.9 in 1977 to 1217.7 per 100,000 residents in 1978, this is a 7% increase.

A total of 6024 burglaries were cleared in 1978 for a 13% clearance rate. Burglary arrests comprised 21% of the total clearances and 28% of the Property Crime clearances.

In the over 18 age classification, the 25-29 age group accounted for 577 burglary clearances or 10% of the total burglary clearances. The 18 year old group accounted for 479 clearances or 8% of the burglary clearances. Ninety-six per cent of the arrests for burglary were male. Fifty-two per cent of the arrestees were white with the remaining 48%, black.

Juveniles effected 42% of the burglary clearances in 1978 with the greatest number of clearances occurring in the 16 year age group. This age group accounted for 638 clearances or 25% of the total juvenile clearances for burglary. The second highest age group was the 17 year

old category, with 600 clearances or 24%. The 10 and under age group accounted for the fewest number of clearances, 105 for 4% of the juvenile clearances for burglary.

Ninety-six per cent of the juveniles arrested for burglary were males. Of the juveniles arrested for burglary, 52% were white and the remaining 48% were black.

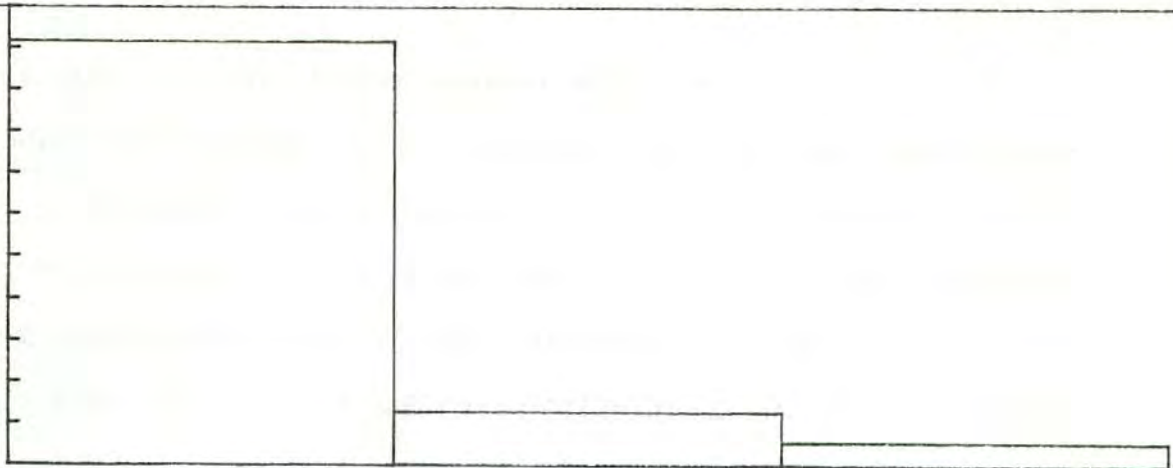
Burglaries are divided into residential and non-residential burglaries by times of day. The greatest number of residential burglaries occur during the day.* In 1978 10,691 daytime burglaries of a residence were reported comprising 38% of the reported residential burglaries. A total dollar value of \$4,870,378 was stolen producing an average figure of \$491 per incident. Nighttime burglaries of residences comprised 33% of the residential burglaries with a total value of \$3,578,753 stolen for an average amount of \$388. Twenty-nine per cent of the residential burglaries occurred at unknown times. These burglaries resulted in a total dollar value of \$4,085,482 worth of property stolen effecting an average dollar amount per incident of \$491.

Non-residential burglaries comprise 38% of the total reported burglaries in 1978. Of the non-residential burglaries, 60% occurred at night with only 9% occurring during daylight hours; 31% of the non-residential burglaries occurred at unknown times.

* Day is designated as the hours between 6:00 a.m. and 6 p.m. Night is considered 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.

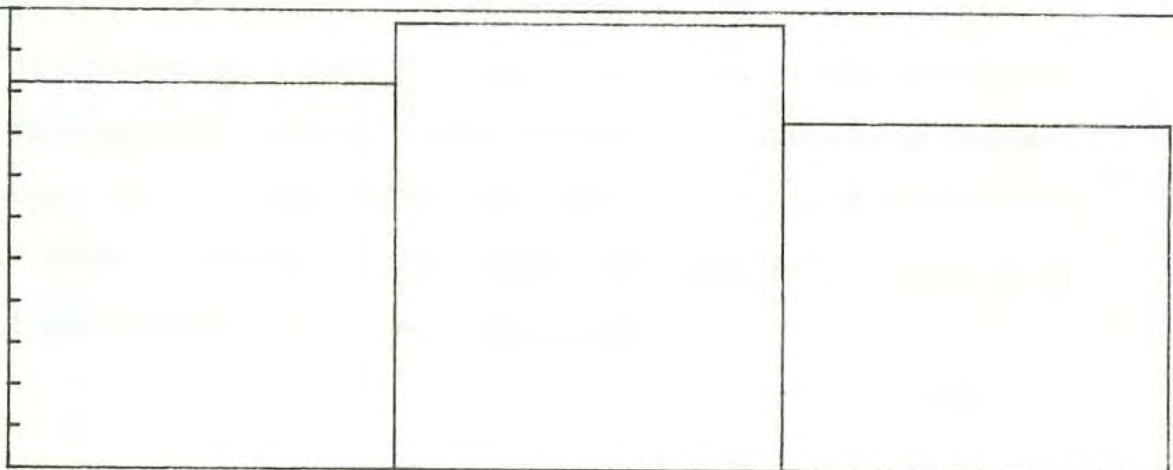

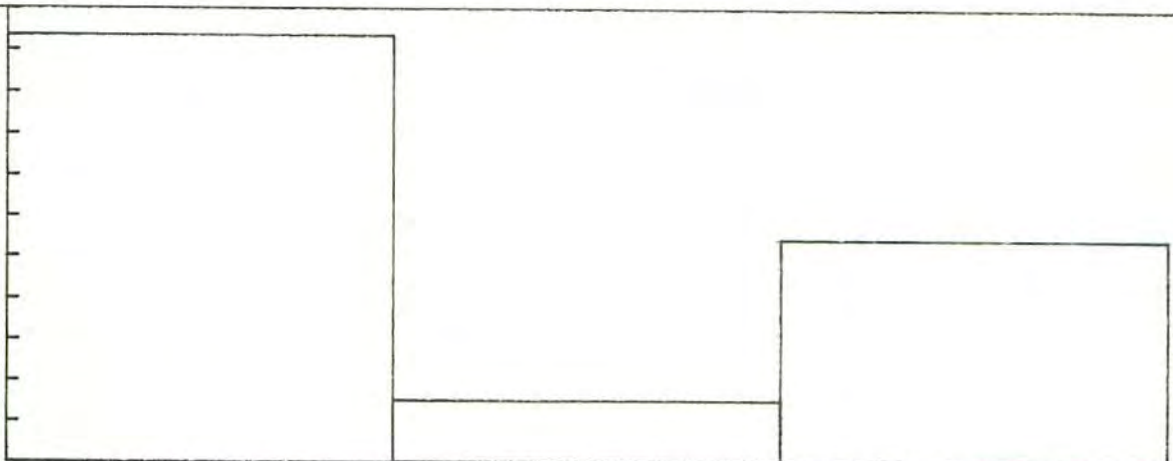

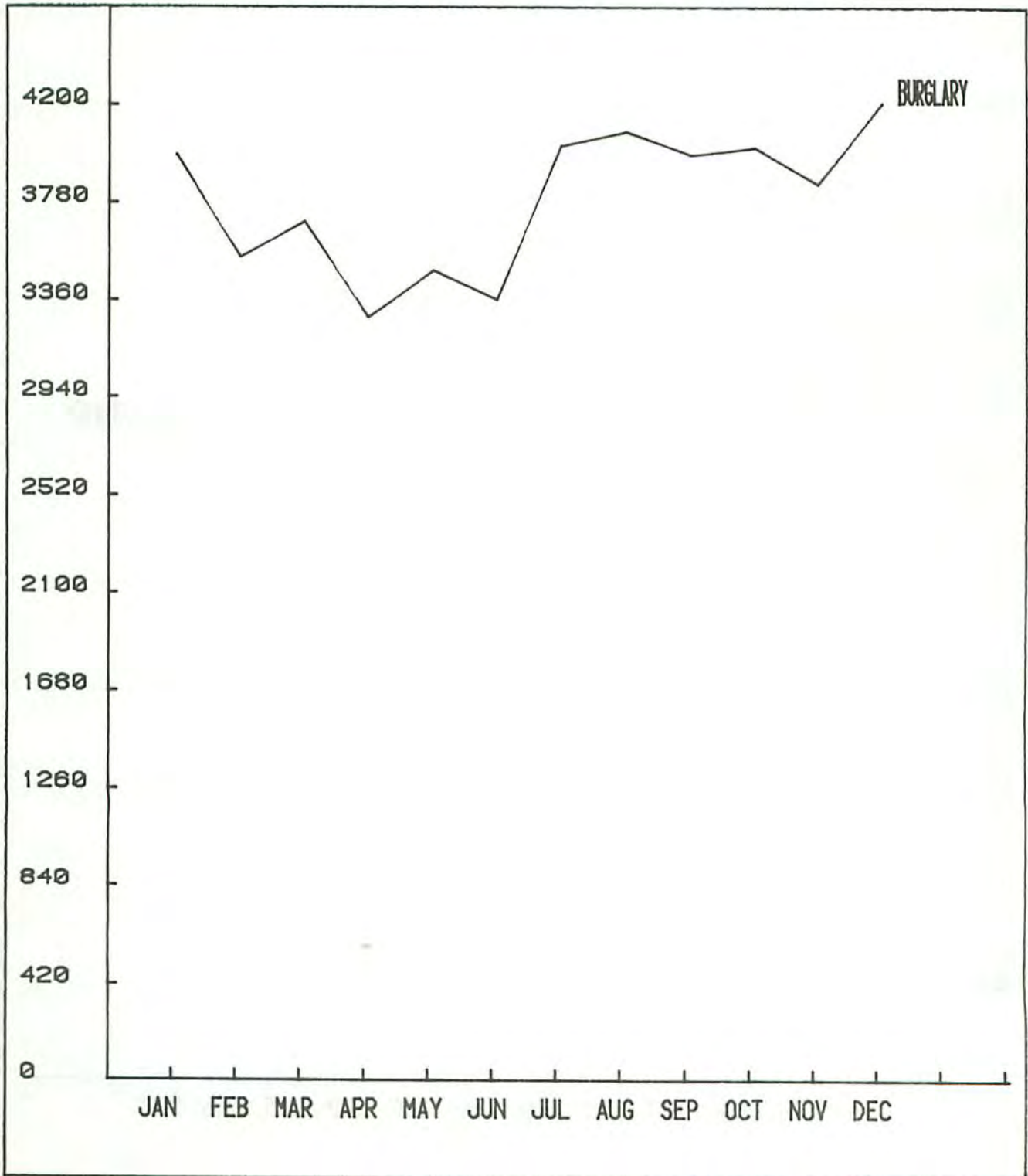
There were 10,337 nighttime non-residential burglaries with a total dollar value of \$4,276,294 stolen for an average dollar value of \$414 per incident. A total of 1526 daytime non-residential burglaries were reported for a total dollar value of \$483,515 producing a \$317 average per incident. Non-residential burglaries, reportedly committed at unknown times, effected a value of \$2,744,500 worth of property stolen for an average dollar value of \$504.

In 1978, 85% of all reported burglaries were classified as a forcible entry; 15% were cleared with 4% being cleared by juveniles. There were 4971 unlawful entries reported in 1978. An unlawful entry involves an unlocked door or window, no force is applied but the element of trespass is essential. Eleven per cent of the reported burglaries were unlawful entries and 12% of these were cleared with 3% being cleared by juveniles. There were 2430 cases of attempted forcible entry reported to police in 1978; 14% of these cases were cleared with 3% being juvenile clearances.

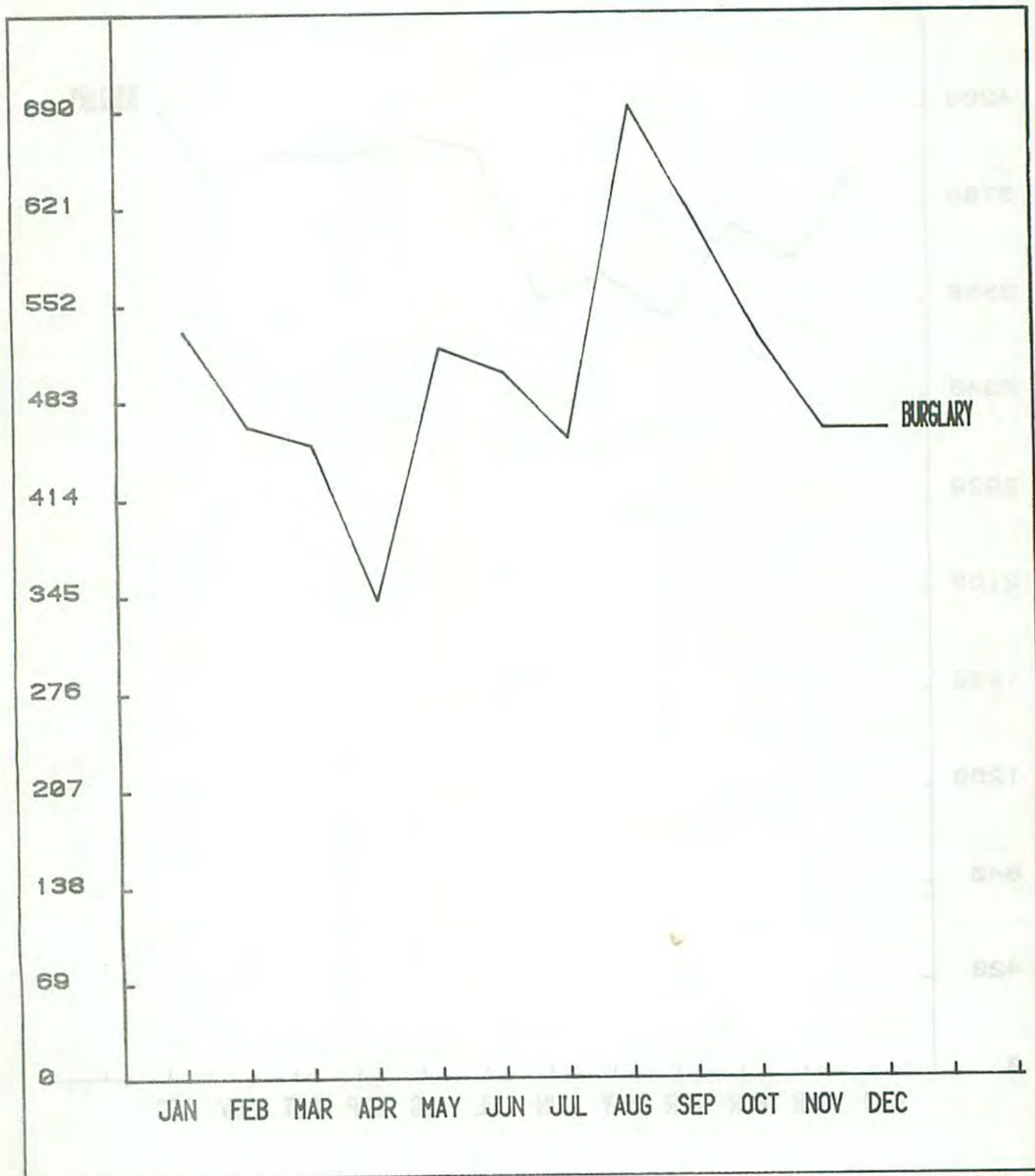

LARCENY

Larceny - the unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence or fraud.

* * * * *

In 1978, reported larceny experienced a 6% increase over 1977 totals. Reported incidences of larceny rose from 69,664 in 1977 to 73,874 in 1978. The larceny rate showed an increase of 3% in 1978, from 1904.4 incidents per 100,000 people in 1977 to 1974.2 cases in 1978.

There were 14,028 arrests for larceny in 1978. These larceny clearances comprise 50% of the total clearances and 66% of the Property Crime clearances. Sixty-nine per cent of the larceny clearances were in the 18 and over age category with the 25-29 year group accounting for 1706 arrests or 12% of the total number of larceny clearances. The 18 year old group accounted for 972 arrests or 7% of the total larceny clearances. The 30-34 year group also had 7% of the larceny clearances with 922 arrests. Sixty-six per cent of those arrested for larceny were males. Fifty-four per cent of those arrested for larceny were black with the remaining 46% being white.

In 1978, there were 4324 arrests involving juveniles. The 13-14 year group accounted for 1041 arrests or 24% of the juvenile clearances; the 16 and 17 year groups accounted for 969 and 962 arrests, respectively, or 22% of the juvenile arrests for each group. The fewest number of

juvenile arrests was in the 10 and under age group which accounted for 195 arrests or 5% of the total juvenile clearances. Juvenile clearances show that 75% of those persons under 18 arrested for larceny were male. Fifty-two per cent of the larceny arrests were blacks with 48% being white.

In breaking down larceny by value stolen, 27% of the larceny incidences involved property or articles valued at \$200 or more producing an average dollar value of \$698 per incident. The \$50-\$200 category effected 37% of the reported larcenies for an average dollar value of \$105. Thirty-six per cent of the reported larcenies were under \$50 and had an average dollar value of \$19 per incident.

The types of larcenies resulting in the greatest number of offenses were thefts of motor vehicle accessories at 16,917 incidences or 23% of reported larcenies. Thefts from motor vehicles accounted for 14,185 incidences or 19% of reported larcenies in Alabama. The average dollar value of thefts involving motor vehicle accessories was \$153 per incident; the average dollar value of thefts from motor vehicles was \$264. Sixteen per cent of the larcenies were thefts from buildings for an average of \$327 per incident. Shoplifting accounted for 7813 incidences or 11% of the reported larcenies. The average dollar value for shoplifting was \$43 per incident. Six per cent of the reported larcenies involved bicycle thefts averaging \$95 per theft. Purse snatching and thefts of coin operated machines each resulted in 2% of the total larceny incidences. An average dollar value of \$111 was obtained for each instance of purse snatching in 1978; coin operated machines averaged \$50 per incident. Pocket picking accounted for 281 larceny

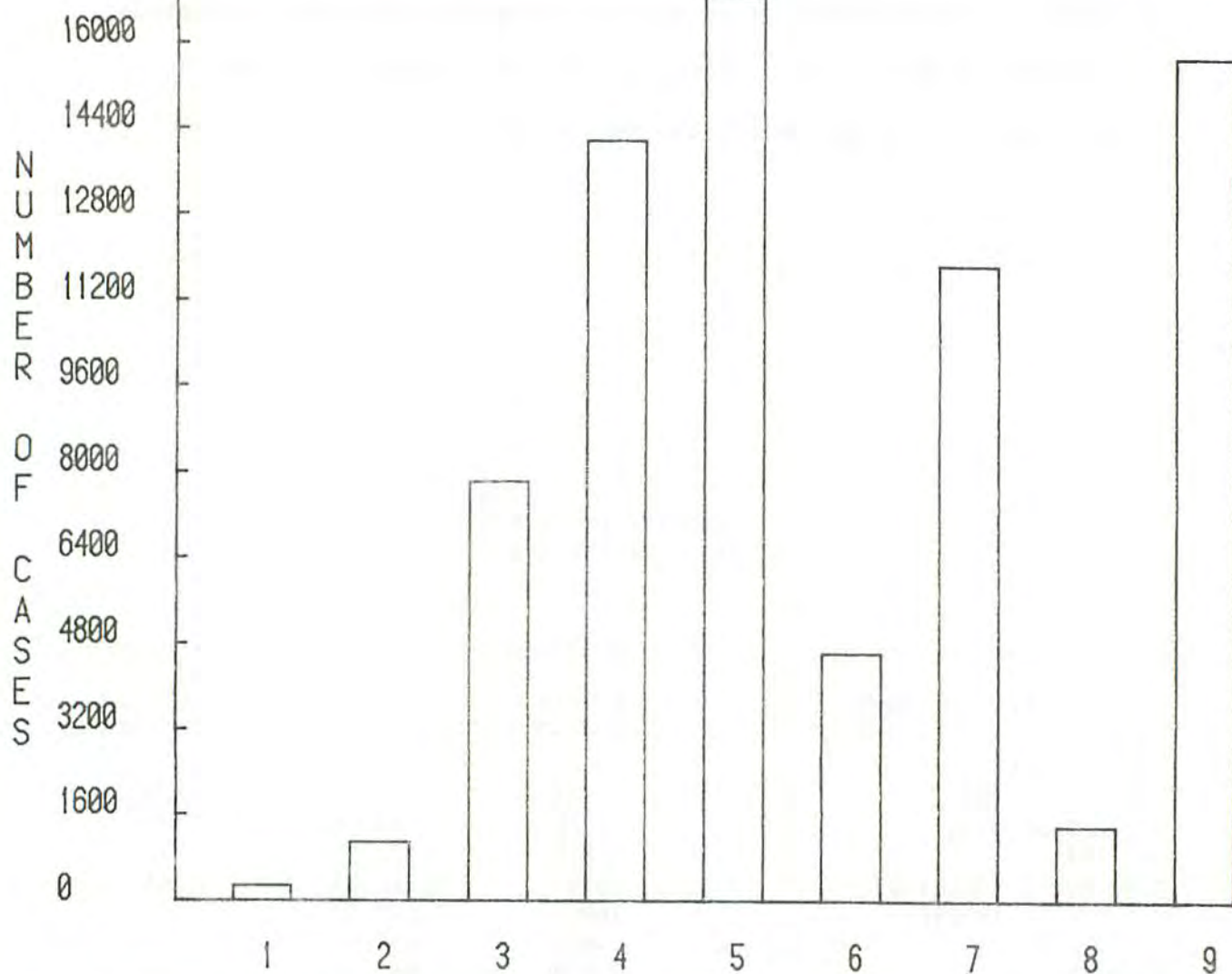
incidences for an average dollar amount of \$155 per theft. Twenty-two per cent of the thefts were reported in the "other" category. This category includes thefts from boats, airplanes, farm and construction equipment, animals, etc. There were 15,742 incidents reported giving an average dollar amount of \$385 per incident.

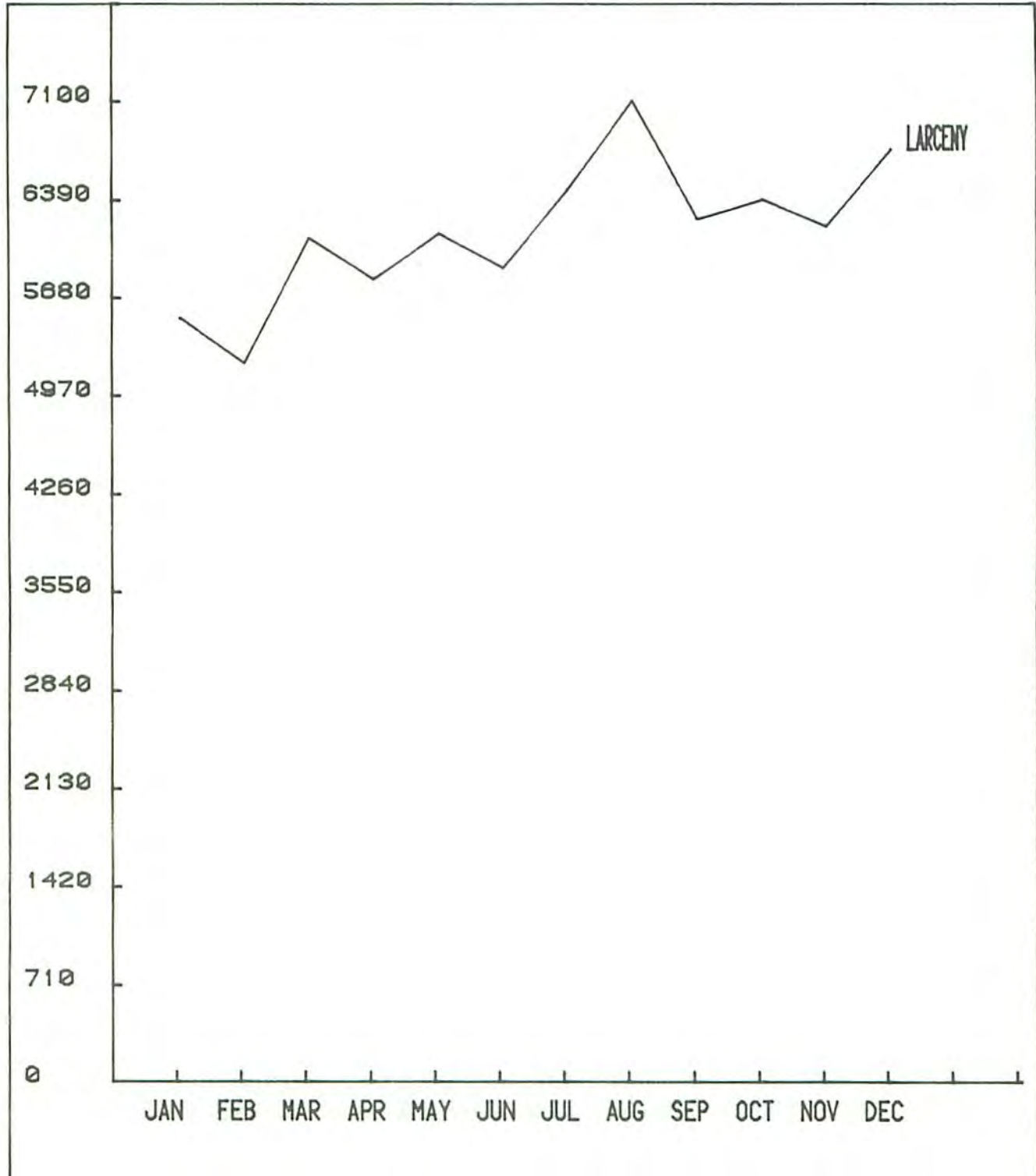

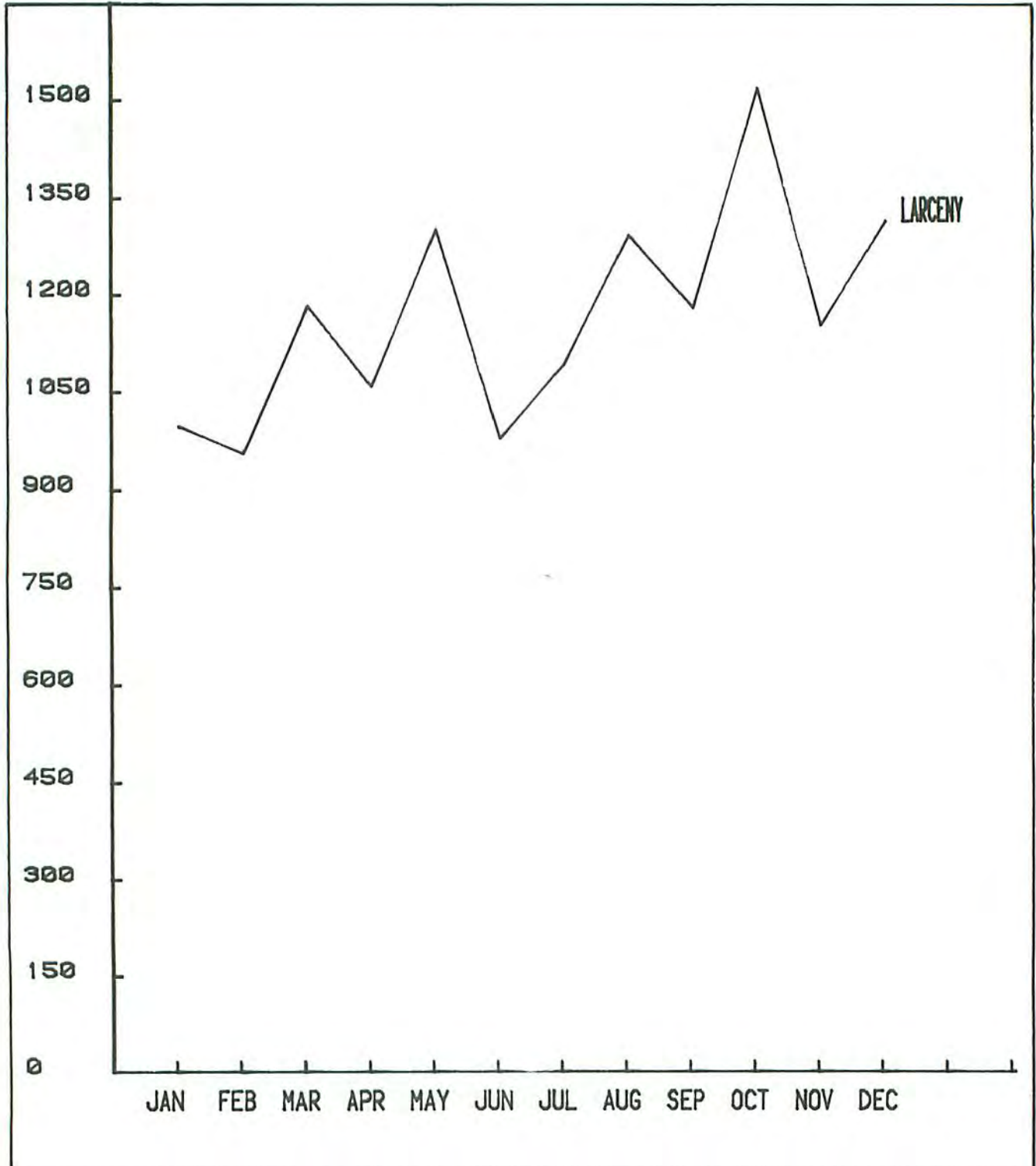

MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Motor Vehicle Theft - the unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, includes attempts.

* * * * *

Motor Vehicle Theft (MVT) increased from 10,328 incidents in 1977 to 11,247 reported cases in 1978 for a 9% increase. The MVT rate rose from 282.3 thefts for every 100,000 population in 1977 to 300.6 thefts per 100,000 in 1978 for a 6% increase.

A total of 1214 MVT's were cleared in 1978 for an 11% clearance rate. Clearances for MVT make up 4% of the total number of clearances and 6% of the Property Crime clearances. For adult clearances, the 25-29 age group had the greatest number of arrests, 132 or 11% of the MVT clearances. Eighteen year olds accounted for 86 clearances or 7% of the total number of MVT clearances.

Ninety-two per cent of those arrested for MVT were males. Fifty-four per cent were white and the remaining 46% were black.

Forty-three per cent of the MVT clearances were juvenile arrests. The juvenile arrests range from one for the 10 and under age group to 140 for both the 16 and the 17 year groups. Ninety-two per cent of the juveniles arrested for MVT were males. Fifty-four per cent were white and 46% were black.

The 11,247 Motor Vehicle Thefts reported in 1978 resulted in \$34,907,854 worth of property stolen averaging \$3,105 per incident.

In a breakdown of Motor Vehicle Theft, 71% of the motor vehicles stolen were automobiles, 18% were trucks and buses, with the remaining 11%, other vehicles. There was a total of 1214 clearances for MVT in 1978 with 7% of the automobile thefts being cleared, 20% of the truck and bus thefts cleared and 18% of the "other" vehicles cleared.

Forty-three per cent of the MVT clearances were juvenile arrests. Eighty-two per cent of the juvenile arrests cleared automobile thefts, 6% cleared thefts of trucks and buses and 12% cleared "other" motor vehicle thefts.

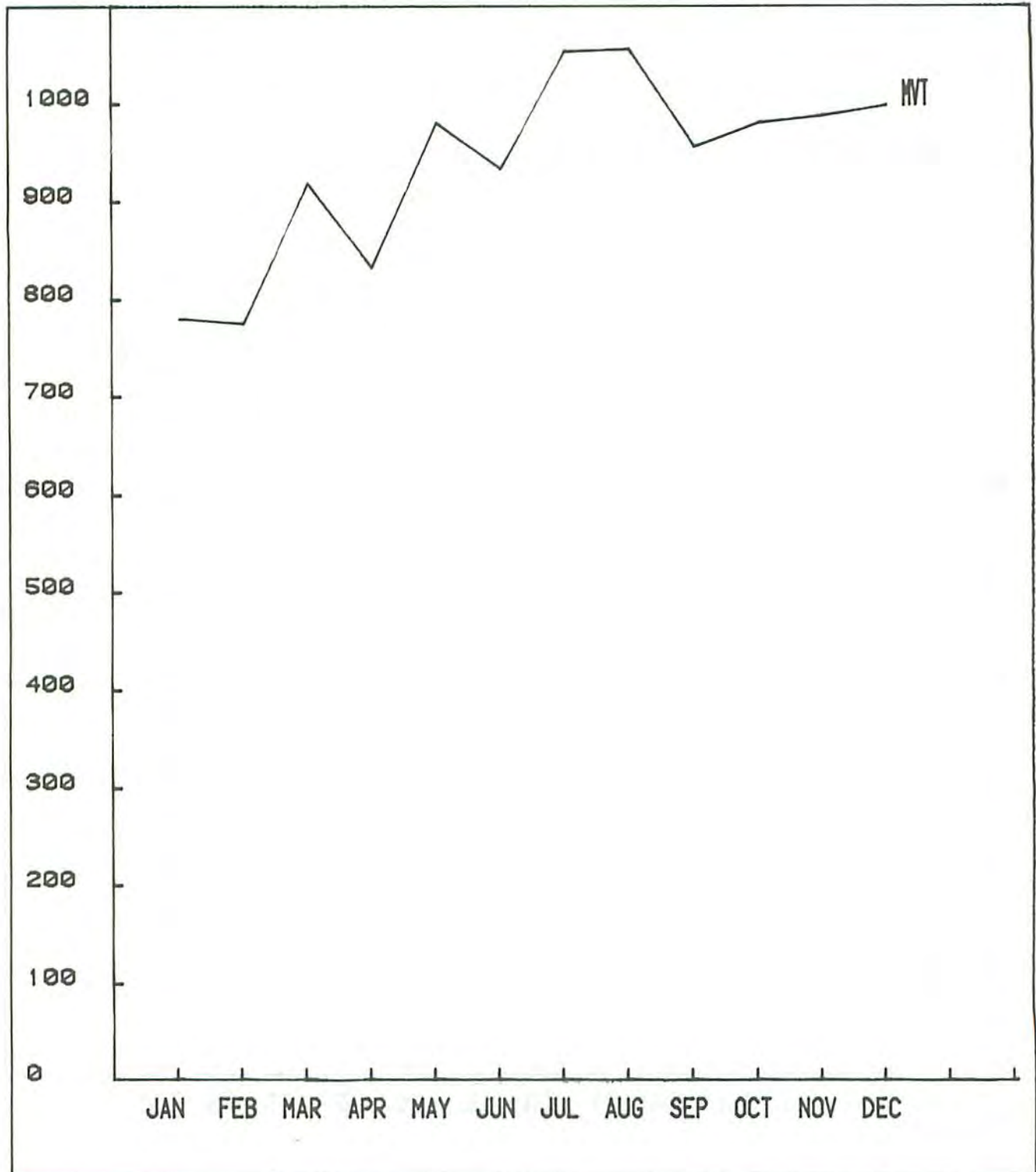

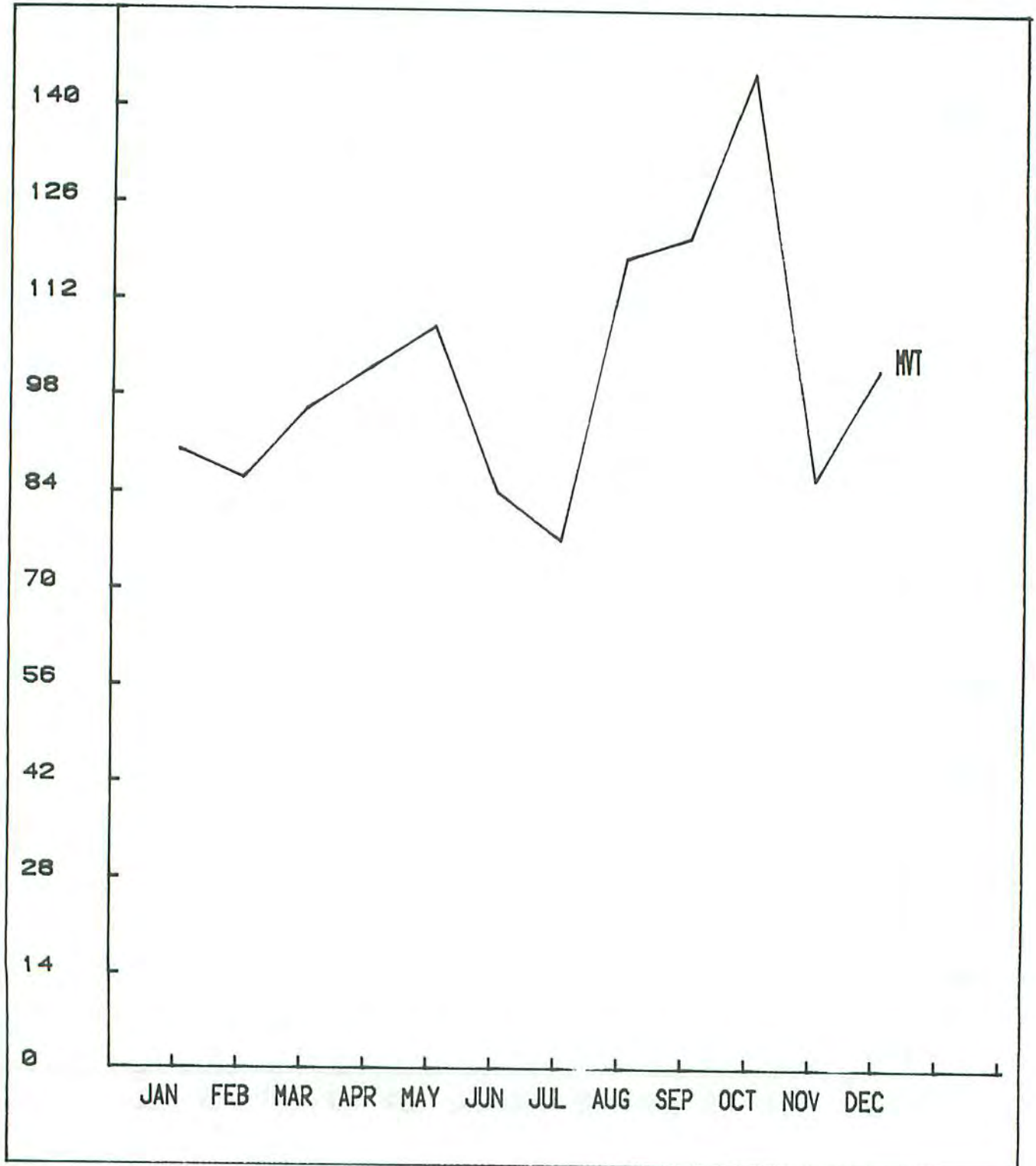

CITY DATA

There are 361 law enforcement agencies in Alabama participating in the UCR program with 286 of these being city police departments.

Alabama's cities will be classified, for the purpose of this report, on the basis of population. Population estimates are derived from data submitted by law enforcement agencies to the Alabama UCR. The city strata used in this report are as follows:

City strata crime data will be totalled for all the cities in a given population group. The tables, on the following pages, group cities according to population and list ORI numbers and city names. The per cent change is the increase or decrease in reported crime over 1977.

Greater Than 250,000

There is only one city in Alabama with a population greater than 250,000. Birmingham's estimated population for 1978 was 310,297. Both Total and Property Crime experienced a 7% increase over 1977.

* * * * *

Cities 50,000 - 250,000

Five Alabama cities have estimated populations between 50,000 and 250,000. Of these five cities, Montgomery, alone, experienced a decrease in reported crime in 1978. It dropped 3%. Huntsville experienced the greatest increase in reported crime, 16%, followed by Tuscaloosa with 12%. Mobile experienced a 7% increase and Gadsden, 2%.

* * * * *

Cities 25,000 - 50,000

Ten cities are included in this population grouping. Of these ten cities, three experienced a decrease in reported criminal activity in 1978. Selma had a 20% decrease in reported crime with Hoover and Florence experiencing a -7% and -5%, respectively. Phenix City showed the greatest increase in reported crime, 35% followed by Decatur with a 34% increase over 1977. Auburn had a 17% increase and Prichard, 11%. Bessemer and Anniston both experienced a 9% increase in reported crime in 1978. Dothan experienced the smallest increase in reported crime in 1978, 1%.

* * * * *

Cities 10,000 - 25,000

Of the seventeen cities in this stratum, Troy experienced the sharpest increase in reported crime from 192 incidents in 1977 to 481 in 1978 for a 151% increase. It is possible that this is just an increase in reporting. Alex City and Talladega also experienced sharp increases in reported crime, 75% and 50%, respectively. Thirty-five per cent of these cities experienced a decrease in reported crime with Andalusia showing the sharpest decline in reported crime, -37%, followed by Mountain Brook with -17%.

* * * * *

Cities 5,000 - 10,000

There are thirty-seven cities in Alabama which fall into the 5,000-10,000 population stratum. Of these cities, reported crime ranged from 68 incidences in Roanoke to 685 in Eufaula. The average number of offenses reported was 301 with the median, or midpoint, being 290.

Northport experienced the greatest percentage increase in 1978, 333%; Daleville's reported crime increased 173%. Brewton showed the sharpest decrease in reported crime, -66%. Albertville reported one less offense in 1978 over 1977. For this stratum, the average increase in reported Part I Offenses was 22%.

* * * * *

Cities 10,000 - 5,000

One hundred twenty-one Alabama cities are in the 1,000-5,000 population stratum. Of these cities, 7% reported no Part I Offenses. Sixty-eight per cent of these cities reported 50 or less Part I Index Offenses. Oxford reported the greatest number of Part I Offenses in this stratum, 436 which is a 12% increase over 1977. Bayou la Batre and Satsuma in Mobile County reported 244 and 235 Part I Offenses, respectively. Madison in Madison County reported 238 incidents. Satsuma experienced the greatest increase 41% over 1977; Madison, 20%; and, Bayou la Batre, 16%.

* * * * *

Cities Under 1,000

There are 95 cities in Alabama with populations under 1,000. Thirty-two per cent of these cities did not report any Part I Offenses to law enforcement agencies. Ninety-eight per cent of these cities reported fewer than 100 Part I Offenses with 95% reporting less than 50 offenses.

Hollywood and Pelham reported more than 100 Part I Offenses in 1978. Hollywood reported 183 offenses for a 1564% increase over 1977. This enormous increase is the result of reported assaults increasing from 10 in 1977 to 111 in 1978 and reported larcenies increasing from 1 in 1977 to 23 in 1978.

Pelham reported 150 Part I Offenses in 1978 for a 53% increase over 1977. Both reported larcenies and motor vehicle thefts experienced an increase in 1978 of 63% and 69%, respectively.

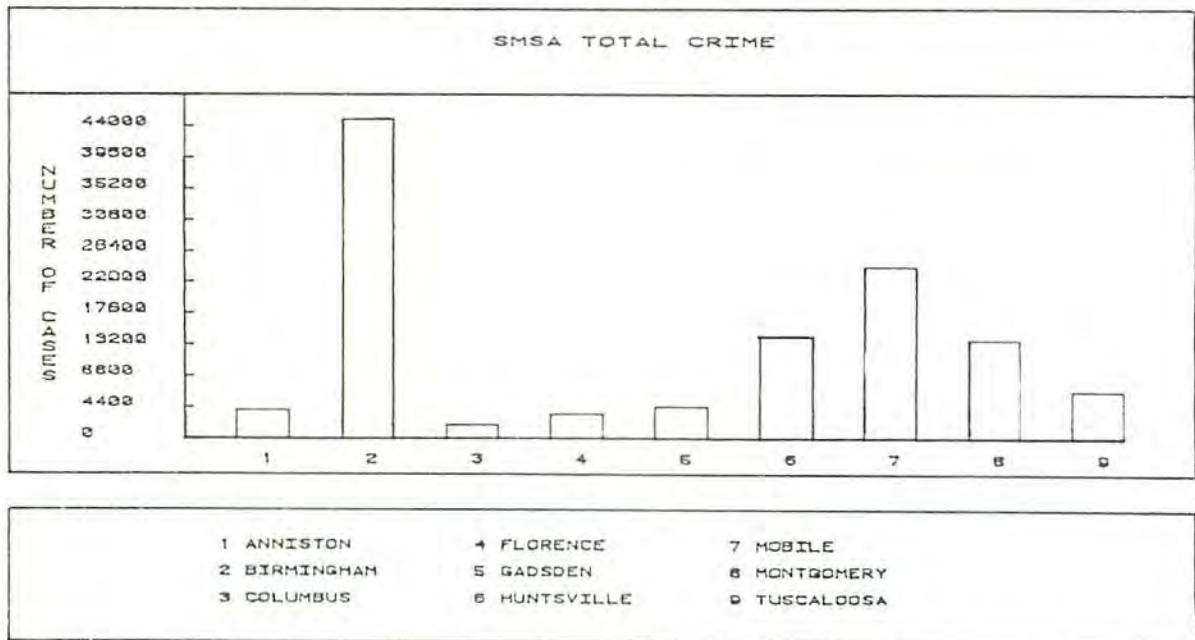

Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA) are comprised of a county or contiguous counties containing a central city of 50,000 residents or more.

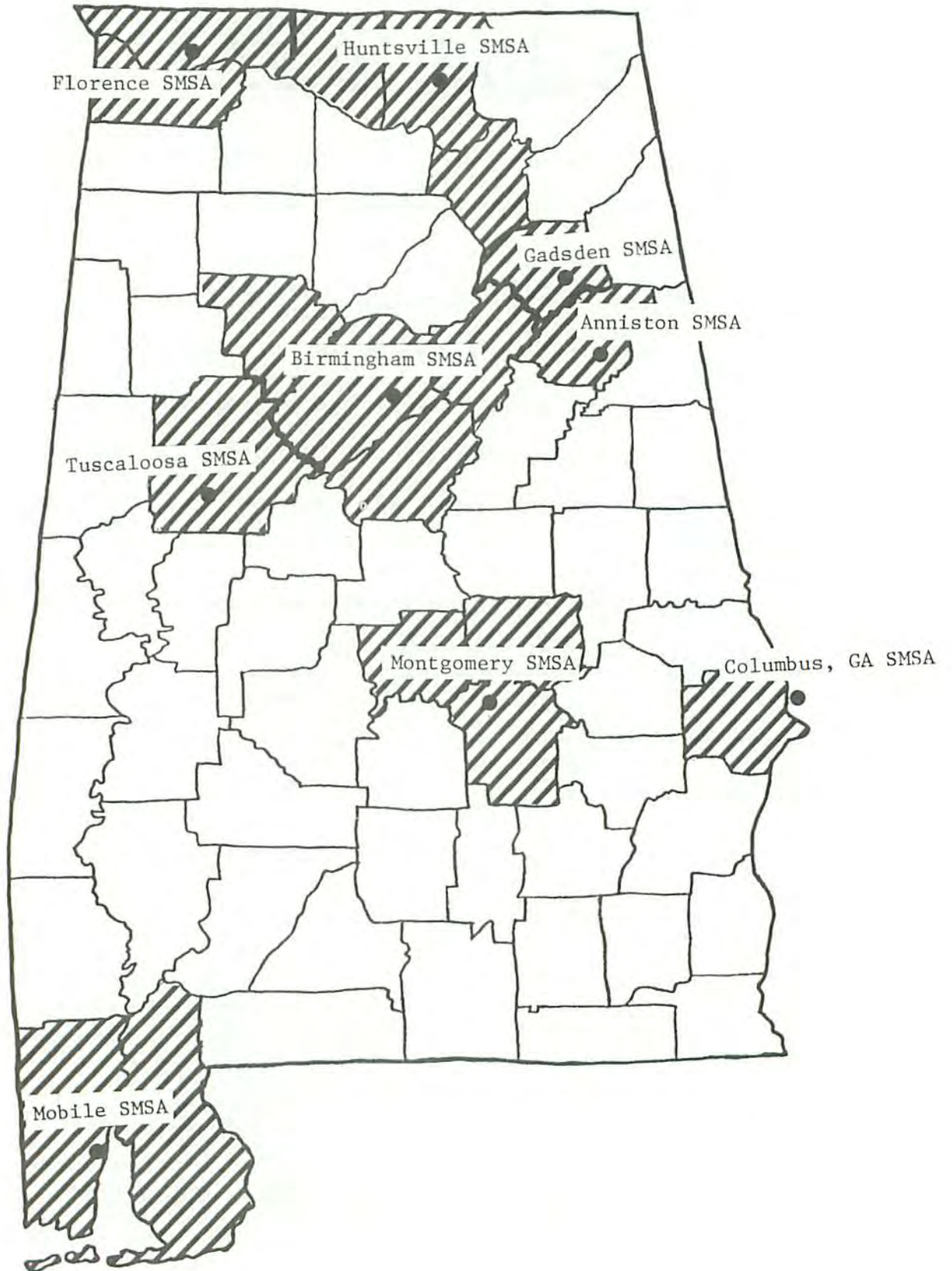

PART 2 ARREST DATA

Part II Offenses is a category of UCR offenses which include:

- *Other Assaults* - nonaggravated assaults.
- *Arson* - willful or malicious burning with or without intent to defraud, includes attempts.
- *Forgery and Counterfeiting* - making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true, includes attempts.
- *Fraud* - fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses.
- *Embezzlement* - misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.
- *Stolen Property* - buying, receiving and possessing stolen property, includes attempts.
- *Vandalism* - willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of property without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control.
- *Weapons* - all violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, includes attempts.

- *Prostitution and Commercialized Vice* - sex offenses of a commercialized nature.
- *Sex Offenses (other than forcible rape, prostitution and commercialized vice)* - statutory rape, offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, etc.
- *Narcotic Drug Laws* - offenses relating to narcotics, i.e., possession, sale, use, growing, and manufacturing of narcotic drugs.
- *Gambling* - promoting, permitting or engaging in illegal gambling.
- *Offenses Against the Family and Children* - non-support, neglect, desertion, or abuse of family and children.
- *Driving Under the Influence* - driving or operating any motor vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.
- *Liquor Laws* - violations of state or local liquor laws.
- *Drunkenness* - drunkenness or intoxication.
- *Disorderly conduct* - breach of the peace.
- *Vagrancy* - begging, loitering, etc.
- *All Other Offenses* - all violations of state or local laws, excepting categories mentioned above, Part I Offense, and traffic violations.

Since many violations go undetected until an arrest is made, which is the nature of many Part II Offenses, only arrest data is collected by UCR.

A total of 167,191 persons were arrested in Alabama last year for Part II Offenses. Ninety-four per cent of those arrested were 18 and over and 6% were juveniles.

The 25-29 age group accounted for 15% of the Part II Arrests with the 30-34 year group accounting for 12% of the clearances. In 84% of the Part II Offenses, 25-29 year olds accounted for the greatest number of arrests. In 16% of the offense categories, other age groups effected the majority of the arrests. These offenses include embezzlement with 24% of those arrested being 40-44 years old; commercialized vice showed 21 and 25-29 year old groups both accounting for 14% of these arrests; and, 12% of those arrested for public drunkenness were 40-44.

Liquor Laws Violations

Driving under the Influence (DWI) resulted in 35,026 arrests, 98% of those arrested were over 18. The 25-29 age group effected the majority of the adult arrests, 5213 or 15%. Of the adults arrested for DWI, 66% were white males, 28% black males, 4% and 2% for white females and black females, respectively. Sixty-five per cent of the juveniles arrested for DWI were 17 year olds. One per cent of those arrested were under 14. There was one DWI arrest in the 10 and under age group, one in the 11-12 group and 3 in the 13-14 age category. Eighty-five per cent of the juveniles arrested for DWI were white males, both black males and white females each accounted for 7% of the total juvenile arrests for DWI. Black females accounted for 1% of the arrests.

There were 13,554 arrests made for liquor law violations with 92% of the arrests being adults. These adult arrests show 73% were white males, 19% black males, 5% white females, and 3% black females. Juvenile arrests show 78% were white males, 9% black males, 12% white females and 1% black females.

In 1978, 37,883 persons were arrested for public drunkenness. Ninety-eight per cent of those arrested were adults. Of the adult arrests, 67% were white males, 27% black males, 4% and 2% for white females and black females, respectively. Juvenile arrests show 81% were white males, 10% black males, 8% white females and 1% black females.

Drug Violations

There were 8787 drug related arrests in 1978 comprising 5% of the Total Part II Arrests. Eighty-five per cent of those arrested on drug charges were adults with 75% of the adults arrested on possession charges. Marijuana sale and possession effected the greatest number of arrests, 6363 or 85% of the adult drug arrests. The 25-29 age group accounted for 18% of the adult drug arrests. White males accounted for 61% of the adult drug arrests with black males comprising 28%. White females accounted for 7% and black females, 4%.

There were 1315 juveniles arrested on drug related charges with 29% of the juveniles arrested being 17 year olds. Ninety-one per cent of the juvenile drug arrests in 1978 were sale or possession of marijuana.

There was one juvenile under 10 arrested for possession of marijuana and 4 juveniles 11-12 arrested for marijuana possession. One juvenile 11-12 years of age was arrested for possessing synthetic drugs. Sixty-eight per cent of the juvenile drug arrests were white males, 16% were black males. White females accounted for 14% of the drug arrests and black females, 2%.

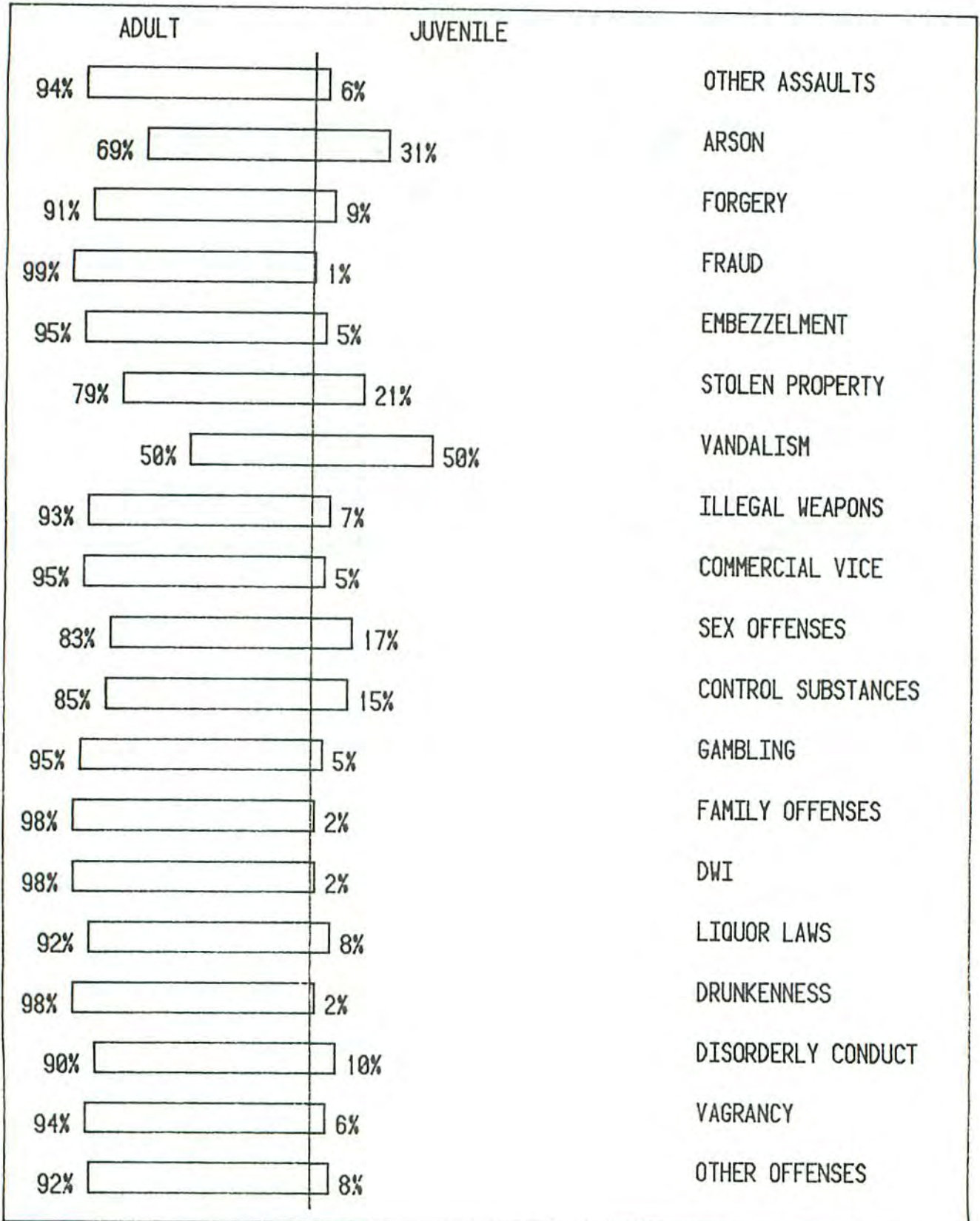

LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS

KILLED OR ASSAULTED

Killed In Action

In 1978, two officers were reported as killed in action by felonious act. One incident involved a car chase; the officer was killed when his car struck a bridge abutment and exploded. The suspect was apprehended and charged with manslaughter. In the second incident, an officer was killed by sniper fire. To date, this crime has not been cleared.

Assaults

In 1978, a total of 729 law enforcement officers were assaulted while performing their duties. Of these 729 officers, 18% were seriously injured while 82% received minimal or no injuries.

Type of Activity

The type of activity which resulted in the highest number of assaults on police officers was attempting other arrests. This type of activity resulted in 28% of the total assaults with 91% of these assaults being cleared. The second highest risk activity was responding to "disturbance" calls which include family quarrels, man with a gun, etc., with 27% of the total assaults. This category had a 94% clearance rate. Handling, transporting, custody of prisoners resulted in 110 assaults in 1978. This was 15% of the total law enforcement officers assaulted; 89% of these assaults were cleared. Ninety-two officers were assaulted during traffic related activities, i.e., traffic pursuits, stopping vehicles, etc. Eighty-two per cent of these assaults were cleared. In Alabama last year, one officer was assaulted by ambush and this crime was not cleared. Investigating suspicious persons or circumstances effected 40 assaults, or 5% of the total assaults on law enforcement officers. Eighty-three per cent of these assaults were cleared. Five assaults were made on officers by mentally deranged persons accounting for 1% of the total assaults; 80% of these assaults were cleared. Civil disorders resulted in 18 assaults or 3% of the total assaults with a 72% clearance rate. Activities involving burglaries and robberies in progress or pursuing burglary and robbery suspects accounted for 2% and 1%, respectively. Burglary related assaults had a clearance rate of 93% while robbery related assaults had a clearance rate of 25%. The "other" category represented 5% of the total assaults and had a 100% clearance rate.

Type of Assignment

Forty-six per cent of all assaults on law enforcement officers occurred in two-man vehicles; 33% of these were responding to disturbance calls and 25% for attempting other arrests.

One-man vehicles sustained 24% of the total assaults with 30% of these occurring while attempting other arrests. One-man vehicle assists accounted for 17% of the total assaults with 39% of these being disturbance calls and 32% being attempting other arrests.

Detective or special assignment alone and assisted categories had 3% of the total assaults. The greatest number of these assaults occurred while handling, transporting, custody of prisoners.

The "other" category alone and assisted accounted for 2% and 5%, of the assaults, respectively.

Type of Weapon

In 80% of the assaults on law enforcement officers for 1978, hands, feet, fists, etc., were used to perpetrate the assault (81% of these assaults resulted in minimal or no injury to the officer). Thirty-one per cent of these assaults occurred while attempting other arrests with 25% occurring in response to disturbance calls and 17% in handling, transporting, custody of prisoners.

Firearms were used in 7% of the assaults (95% of these resulted in minimal or no injury to the officer). Fifty-five per cent of these assaults with firearms were in answering disturbance calls, 15% resulted from investigating suspicious persons or circumstances; and, 9% in attempting other arrests.

In 4% of the assaults, a cutting instrument was used (96% of these resulted in minimal or no injury to the officer). Fifty per cent of these assaults occurred while answering disturbance calls; 15% occurred while attempting other arrests.

In 9% of the reported assaults, weapons other than firearms, cutting instruments and hands, fists, feet, etc., were used (70% of these resulted in minimal or no injury to the officer). Twenty-five per cent of these assaults resulted from traffic pursuits and stops and 24% while attempting other arrests. Responding to disturbance calls resulted in 18% of assaults with "other" weapons.

GLOSSARY

Adult - the UCR system defines adults as over 18 years of age.

Arrests - a measure of law enforcement activity by which an individual is detained in legal custody.

Assault - the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury, including attempts. Attempted homicide is listed as an assault.

Burglary - unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.

Central city - a city with at least 50,000 residents.

City strata - a breakdown of cities according to population.

Clearance - a measure of law enforcement activity by which (1) enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody or (2) by exceptional means which provides a solution to a crime without formal charges being brought against a suspect. It is possible for one arrest to clear more than one offense or for several arrests to clear one offense.

Clearance rate - the clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of clearances over the number of crimes reported.

Crime rate - a measure of criminal activity which shows the number of crimes reported per 100,000 residents.

Criminal activity - measured by reported crimes, trends, rates.

Forcible entry - offenses in which force of any kind is used to unlawfully enter a structure for the purpose of committing a theft or a felony.

Homicide - the willful killing of another as based on police investigation.

Juveniles - the UCR system defines juveniles as males and females under 18 years of age.

Larceny - unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence or fraud.

Law enforcement activity - police activity as measured by clearances and arrests.

Minimal injury - personal injury involving abrasions, minor lacerations requiring no more than usual first-aid treatment.

Motor vehicle theft - unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, including attempts.

Non-residence - any structure used for purposes other than a residence.

Part I Index Crimes - a category of UCR offenses deemed more serious and/or most frequent. These Part I Index Crimes include homicide, rape, robbery, assault, burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft.

Part II Offenses - a category of UCR offenses which include:

Other assaults - non-aggravated assaults.

Arson - willful or malicious burning with or without intent to defraud, includes attempts.

Forgery and counterfeiting - making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true, includes attempts.

Fraud - fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses.

Embezzlement - misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.

Stolen property - buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, includes attempts.

Vandalism - willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of property without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control.

Weapons - all violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, includes attempts.

Prostitution and commercialized vice - sex offenses of a commercialized nature.

Sex offenses (other than rape, prostitution, and commercialized vice) - statutory rape, offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, etc.

Narcotic drug laws - offenses relating to narcotics, i.e., possession, sale, use, growing and manufacturing of narcotic drugs.

Gambling - promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling.

Offenses against the family and children - non-support, neglect, desertion, or abuse of family and children.

Driving under the influence - driving or operating any motor vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.

Liquor laws - violations of state or local liquor laws.

Drunkenness - drunkenness or intoxication.

Disorderly conduct - breach of the peace.

Vagrancy - begging, loitering, etc.

All other offenses - all violations of state or local laws, excepting categories mentioned above, Part I Offenses, and traffic violations.

Property crimes - (non-violent crimes) index crimes which lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s). Included in this category are burglary, larceny, and motor vehicle theft.

Recovery - finding stolen property. It should be noted that a *recovered article* does not *clear* a crime, although the owner is reunited with his property a crime *was* committed and a suspect must be taken into custody to *clear* the offense.

Reported crimes - crimes reported to law enforcement officials.

NOTE: In this report, only those offenses which prove to be actual offenses are used. Those cases which have been deemed *unfounded* are excluded from the crime totals. (It should be mentioned that a change in reporting on the part of victims can effect an increase or a decrease for certain crimes.

Residence - any dwelling structure used for human habitation.

Robbery - stealing or taking anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person, in his presence, by force or by threat of force, including attempts. Robbery is broken down into seven categories:

1. *Highway* - robberies occurring on the streets, in alleys outside of structures.
2. *Commercial house* - hotels, motels, lodging houses, loan companies.
3. *Gas or service stations* - sell gasoline and related products.
4. *Convenience stores* - neighborhood stores which specialize in the sale of consumable items.

5. *Banking establishments* - banks, savings & loan institutions, credit unions, etc.
6. *Residence* - robberies within homes, apartment houses, and premises thereof.
7. *Miscellaneous* - churches, temples, schools, union halls, government buildings, public transit systems, etc.

Serious injury - personal injury is considered serious if there are broken bones, internal injuries, or if stitches are required.

Standard metropolitan statistical area (SMSA) - is a county or contiguous counties which contain at least one city of 50,000 inhabitants or more, or "twin cities" with a combined population of at least 50,000.

Uniform Crime Reports - standardized reporting forms used by law enforcement officials to report criminal activity within their jurisdiction.

Uniform Crime Reporting System - is the depository of the Uniform Crime Reports providing for the collection and dissemination of crime data.

Unlawful entry - involves no force and is achieved by use of an unlocked door or window. The element of trespass is essential.

Violent crimes - (person crimes) index crimes which are offenses perpetrated against a person (or persons) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim. Crimes included in this category are homicide, rape, robbery, and assault.
