

## PREFACE

This report is the undertaking of the Statistical Analysis Center (SAC), a component of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center. SAC is responsible for analyzing and disseminating criminal justice statistics.

The 1980 Crime in Alabama report is intended to inform law enforcement officials and private citizens of criminal and law enforcement activity in Alabama; these data are then used for analyzing crime problems inherent in the criminal justice system and as a foundation for planning and budgeting.

Geographic areas covered in this report include the State of Alabama, Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA's), county and city strata. A 1980 Crime by County report is contained in Appendix A.

We would like to extend our appreciation to the Uniform Crime Reporting Section of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center for the data used in this report. Thanks are also due to law enforcement agencies -- sheriffs' departments, municipal police departments, and campus police -- for their cooperation in the UCR program.

## INTRODUCTION

In October of 1975, Act 872 passed both houses of the Alabama Legislature creating and establishing the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center (ACJIC) which is commissioned to collect, store, retrieve, analyze, and disseminate criminal justice data. Inherent in ACJIC is a "uniform crime reporting system for the periodic collection and analysis of crimes reported to any and all criminal justice agencies within the state." (Act 872, § 9, 1975)

As a result of Act 872, 1976 was the first year that mandatory reporting was required of law enforcement agencies in Alabama; prior to 1976, law enforcement agencies participated in the FBI's Uniform Crime Reporting System (UCR) on a voluntary basis. Mandatory submission has resulted in a 185% increase in reporting over 1975.

Alabama's UCR program functions in accordance with FBI standards of operation, i.e., a uniform data collection device and quality control procedures which provide viable crime statistics and an accurate indication of crime and crime trends.

ACJIC has recently initiated an incident-based reporting system as an alternative to UCR. The Incident-Based Reporting System (IBR) provides a self-contained internal recordkeeping system for the agency as well as data for ACJIC to generate UCR.

IBR is a voluntary system with 49% of Alabama's agencies participating. Law enforcement agencies have the option of utilizing IBR instead of UCR summary since comparable data elements can be obtained from IBR forms. All the information obtained by the investigating officer is recorded on the IBR forms and a copy is sent to ACJIC. This information is more detailed in nature than requisites for UCR. This wealth of information provides great potential for better services, analyses, and resource studies by both individual agency's crime analysis units and ACJIC.

Alabama's law enforcement agencies are supplied with monthly reporting forms, either UCR summaries or IBR forms. ACJIC's Technical Assistance field staff are made available to the reporting agencies to help answer any questions which may arise regarding forms, crime classifications, and clearance data. The Technical Assistants are also responsible for training law enforcement personnel and maintaining the quality of information for output to the criminal justice system.

When the UCR summaries or incident reports are returned to ACJIC, they are reviewed for accuracy by the quality control section of UCR. Then, the Alabama UCR program furnishes the FBI with monthly data for their verification and review process.

# **CRIME AND ARREST DATA**

Studying criminal activity is one of the best ways to combat crime. Valid crime data can provide a solid foundation for statistical analyses, management-oriented analyses and crime breakdowns. These projects can then aid local police departments in laying out patrol districts, assigning patrol units, and designing community education programs.

Data used in this report is provided by the Uniform Crime Reporting section of the Alabama Criminal Justice Information Center. Both UCR Summaries and Incident Report forms are submitted to ACJIC's UCR section which is the depository for reported offenses and has the responsibility of collecting and disseminating crime data.

In 1980, a total of 369 agencies reported known offenses to Alabama's UCR; 49% of Alabama's law enforcement agencies submitted Incident Reports and 51% returned UCR Summaries.

Through a mandate of Congress, Arson is counted as a Part I Offense. So as not to distort percentage changes in total Index Crime and Property Crime, Arson totals will not

be included in these sections but will be included in a separate section on Arson which follows the section on the property crimes.

Crime data are obtained from the Part I Index of Offenses submitted by law enforcement agencies to Alabama's UCR program. These Part I Offenses are divided into Violent Crimes and Property Crimes.

Violent Crimes include Homicide, Rape, Robbery, and Assault. These crimes are considered violent inasmuch as they are offenses perpetrated against a person(s) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim(s).

Property Crimes are comprised of Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson\*. Property or Non-Violent Crimes lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s).

Clearance and arrest data are also reported to Alabama's UCR. A crime is considered cleared when enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody. It is conceivable that one arrest could clear several offenses or that several arrests could clear one offense. A crime may also be cleared by exceptional means in which a solution to a crime is found without formal charges being brought against a suspect. The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of clearances over the number of crimes reported.

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\*A separate section on Arson will be included in this report.

This report is a composite picture of criminal and law enforcement activity in Alabama for 1980. It provides a breakdown for the State, the State's eight Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA's) and localities participating in the UCR program. The report concentrates on the Index Crime of the FBI's Part I Offenses and offers tabular and narrative formats for comparisons, trends, rates, and percentage changes.

# **TOTAL INDEX CRIME**

Total Index Crime is comprised of the Part I Offenses: Homicide, Rape, Robbery, Assault, Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson\*. Both crime and arrest data are collected for Part I Crime.

In 1980 the Total Index Crime reached 188,062\*. This is an 18% increase over 1979 figures. The crime rate for Alabama reached 4867.4 crimes per 100,000 people in 1980 which is a 15% increase over 1979's crime rate of 4222.1.

Of the Total Index Crimes reported to law enforcement agencies in 1980, 9% of those reported were considered Violent Crimes with 91% being Property Crimes. Violent Crime experienced an 11% increase while Property Crime showed a 19% increase.

All Violent Crimes reported experienced an increase with robbery showing the greatest increase, 23%. Rape experienced a 10% increase and reported assault increased by 6%. Larceny

effected the greatest increase of the Property crimes, 21%. Burglary showed a 20% increase and motor vehicle theft had a 3% increase.

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Of the 188,062 reported offenses, 30,470 were cleared producing a 16% clearance rate. Violent Crimes experienced a 45% clearance rate and 13% of the Property Crimes were cleared.

There were 29,757 persons arrested in Alabama last year for Index Offenses. Seventy-nine percent of the persons arrested were adults. The 25-29 age group accounted for 4,366 arrests or 19% of the adults arrested. The 30-39 year group effected 4,180 arrests or 18% of the total number of adults arrested. Eighteen year olds accounted for 2,200 arrests or 9%. Forty-two percent of the adults arrested were white males and 40% were black males. White females made up 8% of the adult arrests and black females, 10%.

A total of 6,362 juveniles were arrested for Part I Index Crimes in 1980. Seventeen year olds accounted for the greatest number of juvenile arrests, 1,685 or 26%. Sixteen year olds accounted for 24% with 1,537 juveniles in that age group arrested. There were 225 juveniles 10 and Under arrested for Part I offenses for 4% of the total juvenile arrests. Forty-one percent of the juveniles arrested were white males, 45% were black males. White females accounted for 7% of the arrests as did black females.


Arson totals for 1980 have been excluded from the Total Part I Index Offenses to keep trend data more accurate. There were 1,106 incidents of arson reported in 1980, 756 incidents involved structural units; 263 involved mobile property; and 94 included all other types of property. There were 237 arson clearances for a 21% clearance rate. The estimated value of property destroyed by arson in 1980 was \$11,050,745 for an average of \$9,992 per incident.

# PROPERTY CRIME

Property Crime is comprised of Burglary, Larceny, Motor Vehicle Theft, and Arson\*. These crimes are designated as Property Crimes because they lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s).

\* \* \* \* \*

In 1980, a total of 170,945 Property Crimes were reported to law enforcement agencies. This is a 19% increase over Property Crimes reported in 1979. The 1980 reported Property Crimes comprised 19% of the Total Part I Offenses.

Larceny experienced the greatest increase of the Property Crimes, 21%. Burglary showed a 20% increase with Motor Vehicle Theft effecting a 3% increase.

The Property Crime rate increased by 16% in 1980 from 3812.2 incidents per 100,000 people in 1979 to 4424.4 incidents per 100,000 in 1980.

A total of 23,810 Property Crimes were cleared in 1980 for a 13% clearance rate. Juveniles accounted for 3% of the Property Crime clearances.

There were 22,155 persons arrested for Property Crime in 1980. Seventy-four percent of the persons arrested for Property Crime were adults, the remaining 26% were juveniles.

The 25-29 year group accounted for the greatest number of adult arrests, 2901 or 18%. The 18 year olds effected the next highest arrest figures, 1867 for 11% of the adults arrested. Forty-one percent of the adults arrested were white males, 38% were black males. White females accounted for 10% and black females, 11%.

Of the 5731 juveniles arrested for Property Crime, 17 year olds accounted for the greatest number of arrests, 1539 or 17%, followed by 16 year olds with 1282 persons arrested for 14%. There were 211 juveniles 10 and Under arrested for Property Crime in Alabama in 1980; this is 4% of the total number of juveniles arrested. Forty-two percent of the juveniles arrested for property crimes were white males, 44% were black males. White females effected 7% of the arrests as did black females.

Type of Property

The estimated value of property stolen amounted to \$113,734,442\* for Alabama in 1980. This figure is up 28% over the losses reported in 1979 when \$89,000,236 was reported stolen.

The following table provides a breakdown of type of property stolen, dollar value stolen, and amount recovered and the percent recovered.



# VIOLENT CRIME

Violent Crime is comprised of Homicide, Rape, Robbery, and Assault. These crimes are designated as Violent Crimes because they are offenses perpetrated against a person (or persons) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim.

\* \* \* \* \*

Violent Crime in Alabama increased by 11% over 1979. A total of 17,117 offenses were reported in 1980. The Violent Crime rate increased by 8% from 409.9 violent crimes per 100,000 people in 1979 to 443.0 in 1980.

In 1980, reported homicides and reported assaults experienced an increase of 3% and 6% respectively. Rape and robbery both effected increases, 10% and 23%, respectively.

There were 631 juveniles arrested for Violent Crimes in Alabama last year. Eighty-four percent of those arrested were males and 16% females. There were 35 juveniles 12 and Under arrested for Violent Crime, 1 was arrested for rape, 7 for robbery and the remaining 27 were arrested for aggravated assault. Of the 13-14 year olds, 2 were arrested for homicide; 2 for forcible rape; 23 for robbery; and 60 for aggravated assault. The following table gives an age breakdown by sex for juvenile arrests.

Of the total number of persons arrested for Violent Crime, 7% were male juveniles and 1% were female juveniles; 82% of the total number of Violent Crime arrests were adult males and 10% adult females. 

# HOMICIDE

Homicide - the willful killing of another as based on police investigation.

\* \* \* \* \*

In 1980, 504 homicides were reported to Alabama law enforcement agencies. This is a 3% increase over 1979 when 491 homicides were reported. These homicide incidents comprise 3% of the Violent Crime and .3% of the Total Index Crime. The homicide rate remained constant at 13.0 murders per 100,000 people.

A total of 420 homicides were cleared in 1980 for an 83% clearance rate. There were 474 persons arrested for homicide in 1980. Eighty-three percent of those arrested were males and 17% were females. Forty percent of those arrested for homicide were white and 60% were black. Of the adults arrested, the 25-29 age category accounted for 98 arrests or 22% of the adults arrested. The 30-34 age group had 86 persons arrested making up 19% of the total number of adult arrests.

Juveniles accounted for 3% of the homicide clearances. Seventy-one percent of the juveniles arrested for homicide were males. Fifty-two percent of the juveniles were black with the remaining 48% being white.

### Argument

Of the 504 homicides reported in 1980, 335, or 67% resulted from an argument. In 13% of these argument-related homicides, alcohol was listed as a factor.

Disputes over money and/or property and gambling resulted in 5% and 2%, respectively, of the argument-related homicides.

### Felonies

In 1980, 44 people lost their lives resulting from the commission of other felonies. This is 9% of the total homicides in the state.

Two victims were killed in a rape attempt. Twelve people died during a burglary. In two instances, a robber was killed by his intended victim but in 28 cases, the robber killed his victim.

### Homicide/Suicide\*

There were eleven incidents of homicide/suicide in Alabama in 1980. One incident involved a man killing his brother and in another case there was no relationship between victim and offender. One case involved a woman being shot followed by the suicide of her boyfriend. In one case an ex-wife was killed prior to the suicide of her ex-husband. Seven women were killed by their husbands who then committed suicide.

Firearms were used in all eleven incidents, 7 handguns, 3 shotguns, and 1 rifle.

\* The suicides mentioned in this section are not reflected in the homicide totals. Suicide is not included in the count for homicide.

#### Child Abuse

Three children lost their lives in 1980 as a direct result of physical abuse. All three children were black and ranged in age from less than a year, a year and five years. One victim was a female, the other two were males. Hands and fists were listed as the cause of death in two of these cases and a blunt object caused the death of the third. All three of the offenders were black males. In one instance, the offender was the child's father and in another, the stepfather. The third incident involved the mother's boyfriend killing the child.

#### Deadly Use of Force

Seven persons were killed in 1980 by police officers acting in the line of duty. The circumstances surrounding these killings included two homicides, a robbery, two burglaries, threatening a police officer by pointing a weapon at him and a mentally deranged person. These homicides were found to be justifiable.

All of the victims were male as were the officers involved. One black male was killed by a black police officer. The other six victims, three white males and three black males were killed by white officers.

### Police Officers Killed

Five officers died in 1980 while acting in the line of duty. One officer died in a traffic related fatality; both victim and offender were white males. A defective gun misfiring caused the death of an officer. The victim officer was a black male and the offenders were two white males. A black officer was killed by a sniper while patrolling. The offender was not apprehended. Two white male officers were killed, one giving a speeding ticket, the other stopping a suspicious vehicle. The offenders were a white male and a black male, respectively.

### Weapon Type

Seventy-five percent of the homicides occurring in Alabama in 1980 resulted from firearms; handguns effected 54% of the homicides. Cutting instruments were listed as the cause of death in 77 incidents or 15% of the homicides. Blunt instruments effected 20 homicides for 4% of the total. Personal weapons such as hands, fists, feet, etc., resulted in 18 deaths for 4% of the total homicides reported.

Sex/Race of Victims to Offenders

Fifty-six percent of the reported homicides involved black victims and black offenders. White victims with white offenders effected 28% of the homicides. In 5% of the incidents, there was a white victim with a black offender and in 2% of the cases, a black victim and a white offender. Nine percent of the offenders were unknown.

#### Age of Victim



# RAPE

Rape - carnal knowledge of a female through force or the threat of force, includes attempts.

\* \* \* \* \*

There were 1144 rapes reported to law enforcement agencies in 1980. This is a 10% increase over 1979 when 1042 cases were reported. The rape rate\* rose 7% in 1980 over 1979 from 53.2 to 56.9 rapes per 100,000 females. Reported rape made up 7% of the Violent Crime totals and 1% of the Part I Offense totals.

Rape showed a 49% clearance rate in 1980 with 561 rapes cleared. Rape clearances made up 7% of the Violent Crime clearances and 2% of the total Part I clearances. Eight percent of the rape clearances involved juveniles.

The 25-29 age group effected the greatest number of arrests for forcible rape, 116 for 25% of the adult rape arrests. The next largest group was the 30-34 age category with 53 arrests for 12% of the adult rape arrests.

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\*Rape rate is based upon female population estimates.

Of the adult males arrested for forcible rape 47% were white males and 53%, black males.

Forty-four juveniles were arrested for forcible rape in 1980. In 25% of the arrests white males were involved. Black males accounted for the remaining 75%. Two arrests involved 13-14 year old juveniles and six and fourteen for the 15 and 16 year groups, respectively. There were 21 seventeen year olds arrested for forcible rape.



# **ROBBERY**

Robbery - stealing or taking anything of value from the care, custody or control of a person, in his presence, by force or by threat of force, includes attempts.

\* \* \* \* \*

Robbery increased by 23% in 1980 over 1979 from 4131 incidents to 5066. The robbery rate increased from 109.6 in 1979 to 131.1 in 1980.

There were 1413 robberies cleared in 1980 effecting a 28% clearance rate. Robbery clearances accounted for 18% of the Violent Crime clearances and 5% of the Part I clearances.

The 25-29 age group accounted for 21% of the robbery arrests with the next highest age group being 30-34 year olds; they accounted for 12% of the adult robbery arrests.

Twenty-eight percent of the adults arrested for robbery were white males. Sixty-five percent of the adults arrested for robbery were black males with white females and black females making up 2% and 5%, respectively.

Juveniles accounted for 3% of the total robbery clearances in 1980. The greatest number of juvenile arrests occurred in the 17 year age group with 102 arrests or 45% of the juvenile arrests for robbery. The fewest number of arrests were in the 10 and Under and the 11-12 year groups with 3 and 4 arrests, respectively, for 1% and 2% of the juvenile arrests.

### Robbery by Weapon Type

Robbery is classified as a Violent Crime due to the possibility of injury or death to the victim(s). In 58% of the reported robberies, a firearm was used to effect the crime. Of robberies involving firearms, 27% were cleared with 2% being cleared by juveniles. A knife or cutting instrument was used in 10% of the reported robberies; of these robberies, 29% were cleared with 4% being juvenile clearances. Other dangerous weapons effected 7% of the reported robberies; 45% of these were cleared with 6% being cleared by juvenile arrests. Strong-arm robberies resulted in 25% of the reported robberies; 25% of these strong-arm robberies were cleared with 5% being cleared by juvenile arrests.

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### Robbery by Classification

Highway offenses occur on the streets, alleys, and in general view of police patrol. These are robberies occurring outside of structures. In 1980, 36% of robberies were scored in this category with the actual

number of highway robberies being 1804. The total dollar value involved for highway robberies was \$557,295 which gave an average dollar value of \$309 per incident.

Commercial houses are listed as establishments, such as hotels, motels, lodging houses, loan companies, etc. Commercial house robberies were 20% of the total number of robberies in 1980 with 1009 reported incidents. The total dollar amount stolen in this category was \$603,602 for an average of \$598.

Gas or service stations are establishments whose main purpose is selling gasoline and related products. In 1980, there were 400 reported incidents involving gas or service stations for a total dollar amount of \$173,949 and an average of \$435.

Convenience stores are defined as neighborhood stores which specialize in the sale of consumable items. These stores are easily accessible and usually have extended hours of operation. Thirteen percent of the total reported robberies occurred in convenience stores. The 672 convenience store robberies resulted in \$167,777 stolen with an average dollar value of \$250.

Residential robberies are all robberies occurring in a dwelling or on the premises. There were 582 reported residential robberies in 1980 making up 12% of the reported robberies. The total dollar value involved in residential robberies was \$482,099 with an average dollar value of \$828 per incident.

Robberies in the bank category include savings and loan institutions, credit unions, building and loan associations, etc. There were 35 robberies pertaining to banking institutions that were reported to law enforcement officials in 1980. This is less than 1% of the total reported robberies in Alabama. The total dollar amount stolen for bank related robberies was \$162,863 with \$4,653 being the average amount stolen per incident.


The miscellaneous category includes, churches, temples, schools, union halls, government building, public transit systems, offices, etc. Eleven percent of the reported robberies were listed in this category. There were 564 actual cases reported for a total dollar value of \$265,741. This produces an average of \$471 per incident.

# **ASSAULT**

Assault - the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury, includes attempts.

\* \* \* \* \*

There were 10,403 reported assaults in 1980, a 6% increase over 1979. The assault rate for 1980 was 269.2 per 100,000 people.

A total of 5,266 assaults were cleared in 1980 producing a 51% clearance rate. Assault clearances made up 69% of the Violent Crime clearances and 17% of the Part I clearances. Persons arrested between the ages of 25 and 39 make up 45% of the adult assault arrests with the 25-29 age group representing the greatest number of arrests, 962, or 20%, followed by 30-34 with 696, or 15%, and 35-39 with 465, or 10%.

Of the 4,704 adults arrested, 48% were white males; 39% black males; 6% white females and 7% were black females.

Juveniles accounted for 447 assault clearances or 4%. Of the juvenile arrests for assault, 29% were under 15 years, 71% were between 15 and 17 years. The greatest number of juvenile arrests for assault were in the 17 year age bracket with 101 arrests or 30%. Next was the 16 year old group with 74 arrests or 22% of the total juvenile arrests for assault. The age group 10 and Under accounted for the fewest number of arrests,

10, or 3%, of the total juvenile arrests for assault. Thirty-five percent of juveniles arrested for assault were white males and 41% were black males. White females made up 9% of the juvenile arrests while black females made up 15%.

Aggravated assault is sometimes accompanied by the use of a weapon or by means likely to produce death or great bodily harm. In 26% of the reported aggravated assault incidents, a firearm was used. Of these assaults, 50% were cleared with 2% being cleared by juveniles. A knife or cutting instrument resulted in 23% of the reported assaults effecting a 49% clearance rate. Four percent of the clearances were juvenile. Twenty-one percent of the reported assaults were a result of other dangerous weapons; this category has a clearance rate of 45% with a 6% juvenile clearance rate. Aggravated assaults in which the assailant used hands, fists, feet, etc., resulted in 30% of the reported assaults; 56% of these assaults were cleared; the juvenile clearance rate was 5%.



## BURGLARY

Burglary - unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft. Includes forcible entry, unlawful entry and attempted entry.

\* \* \* \* \*

Reported burglaries increased by 20% in 1980 over 1979. There were 58,232 burglaries reported in 1980 compared to 48,494 for 1979. The burglary rate, likewise, experienced an increase, rising from 1286.6 in 1979 to 1507.2 per 100,000 residents in 1980, this is a 17% increase.

A total of 6,971 burglaries were cleared in 1980 for a 12% clearance rate. Burglary clearances comprised 31% of the Property Crime clearances and 23% of the Total clearances.

The 25-29 age group accounted for 17% of the adult burglary arrests with 764 arrests. The 18 year old group accounted for 15% with 677 arrests. Forty-nine percent of the adults arrested for burglary were white males and 46% were black males. White females effected 3% of the arrests and black females made up 2%.

Juveniles made up 3% of the clearances for burglary in 1980. The greatest number of arrests occurred in the 17 year age group. This age group accounted for 543 arrests or 29% of the total juvenile arrests for burglary. The second highest age group were the 16 year olds, with 460 arrests or 25%. The

10 and Under age group accounted for the fewest number of arrests, 53 for 3% of the juveniles arrested for burglary.

Fifty percent of the juveniles arrested for burglary were white males and 47% were black males. Two percent of the juveniles were white females and black females made up 1%.

In 1980, there were 48,770 reported burglaries classified as forcible entry; this is 84% of the reported burglaries. Twelve percent were cleared with 3% being cleared by juveniles. There were 6860 unlawful entries reported in 1980. An unlawful entry involves an unlocked door or window, no force is applied but the element of trespass is essential. Twelve percent of the reported burglaries were unlawful entries and 11% of those were cleared with 2% being juvenile clearances. There were 2602 cases of attempted forcible entry reported to police in 1980 for 4% of the reported burglaries. Twelve percent of these cases were cleared with 3% being juvenile clearances.

#### Residential and Non-Residential Burglaries

Burglaries are divided into residential and non-residential burglaries by time of day. Residential burglaries comprised 66% of all reported burglaries. In 1980, 13,391 daytime\*

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\*Day is designated as the hours between 6:00 a.m. and 6:00 p.m. Night is considered 6:00 p.m. to 6:00 a.m.

burglaries of a residence were reported comprising 35% of the reported residential burglaries. A total dollar value of \$10,836,063 was stolen producing an average figure of \$809 per incident. Nighttime burglaries of residences comprised 20% of the residential burglaries with an estimated value of \$4,934,053 stolen for an average amount of \$648. Forty-five percent of the residential burglaries occurred at unknown times. These burglaries resulted in a total dollar value of \$12,625,381 worth of property stolen effecting an average dollar amount per incident of \$736.

Non-residential burglaries comprise 34% of the total reported burglaries in 1980. Of the non-residential burglaries, 33% occurred at night with 7% occurring during daylight hours; 60% of the non-residential burglaries occurred at unknown times.

There were 6787 nighttime non-residential burglaries reported in 1980 for a total dollar value of \$3,378,307 stolen for an average dollar value of \$498 per incident. A total of 1347 daytime non-residential burglaries were reported for a total value of \$489,398 producing a \$363 average per incident. The 11,948 non-residential burglaries, reportedly committed at unknown times, effected a value of \$6,532,916 worth of property stolen for an average dollar value of \$547.

In 1980, the total number of reported residential burglaries reached 38,150. The estimated dollar amounts stolen in residential burglaries last year was \$28,395,497 for an average

of \$744 per incident. The 20,083 non-residential burglaries made up 34% of all reported burglaries. The estimated dollar values stolen in non-residential burglaries was \$10,400,621 for an average of \$518. All totalled, there were 58,232 burglaries reported to law enforcement officials in 1980. An estimated value of \$38,796,118 was stolen for an average of \$666 per incident.

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

# LARCENY

Larceny - the unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence, or fraud.

\* \* \* \* \*

In 1980, reported larceny experienced a 21% increase over 1979 totals. Reported incidences of larceny rose from 83,553 in 1979 to 100,744 in 1980. The larceny rate showed an increase of 18% in 1980, from 2216.8 incidents per 100,000 people in 1979 to 2607.4 cases in 1980.

There were 13,633 clearances for larceny in 1980 producing a 14% clearance rate. These larceny clearances comprise 60% of the Property Crime clearances and 45% of the Part I Crime clearances. Seventy-six percent of the larceny arrests were adults with the 25-29 year group accounting for 2,032 arrests or 18% of the total number of adult arrests for larceny. The 30-34 year group accounted for 1,213 arrests or 11% of the total adult larceny arrests. The 18 year olds had 10% of the larceny clearances with 1,125 arrests. Thirty-seven percent of the adults arrested for larceny were white males. Thirty-four percent of those adults arrested for larceny were black males. White females comprised 13% of the adults arrested for larceny and black females, 16%.

In 1980, there were 3,598 arrests for larceny involving juveniles. The 17 year group accounted for 906 arrests or 25% of the juvenile arrests for larceny; the 13-14 and 16

year groups accounted for 750 and 847 arrests, respectively; for 21% and 24% of the juvenile arrests for larceny. The fewest number of juvenile arrests was in the 10 and Under age group which accounted for 157 arrests or 4% of the total juvenile arrests. Juvenile arrest data indicates that 38% of those persons under 18 arrested for larceny were white males. Forty-three percent of the juvenile larceny arrests were black males. White females comprised 9% of the juvenile arrests and black females, 10%.

In breaking down larceny by value stolen, 34% of the larceny incidences involved property or articles valued at \$200 or more producing an average dollar value of \$792 per incident. The \$50-\$200 category effected 34% of the reported larcenies for an average dollar value of \$103. Thirty-two percent of the reported larcenies were under \$50 and had an average dollar value of \$18 per incident.

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### Larceny by Type

The type of larceny resulting in the greatest number of offenses was thefts of motor vehicle parts and accessories at 26,094 incidences or 26% of reported larcenies. Thefts from motor vehicles accounted for 17,982 incidences or 18% of reported larcenies in Alabama. The average dollar value of thefts involving motor vehicle accessories was \$181 per incident; the average dollar value of thefts from motor vehicles was \$267. Seventeen percent of the larcenies were thefts from buildings for an average of \$504 per incident. Shoplifting accounted for 9,266 incidences or 9% of the reported larcenies. The average dollar value for shoplifting was \$56 per incident. Six percent of the reported larcenies involved bicycle thefts averaging \$113 per theft. Purse snatching and thefts of coin operated machines each resulted in 1% of the total larceny incidences. An average dollar value of \$172 was obtained for each instance of purse snatching in 1980; coin operated machines averaged \$138 per incident. Pocket picking accounted for 362 larceny incidences for an average dollar amount of \$241 per theft. Twenty-two percent of the thefts were reported in the "other" category. This category includes thefts from boats, airplanes, farm and construction equipment, animals, etc. There were 22,102 incidents reported giving an average dollar amount of \$514 per incident.



# MOTOR VEHICLE THEFT

Motor Vehicle Theft - the unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, includes attempts.

\* \* \* \* \*

Motor Vehicle Theft (MVT) increased from 11,634 incidents in 1979 to 11,969 reported cases in 1980 for a 3% increase. The MVT rate\* for Alabama in 1980 was 390 thefts for every 100,000 vehicles.

A total of 2,206 MVT's were cleared in 1980 for an 18% clearance rate. Clearances for MVT make up 10% of the Property Crime clearances and 7% of the Total clearances.

A total of 632 adults were arrested for MVT in 1980. Of the adults arrested for Motor Vehicle Theft, the 25-29 age group accounted for the greatest number of thefts, 105 or 17% followed by the 30-34 age group with 73 persons arrested for 12%.

Fifty-four percent of the adults arrested for Motor Vehicle Theft were white males and 37% were black males. White females made up 6% and black females accounted for 3%.

There were 273 juveniles arrested for Motor Vehicle Theft in 1980. The greatest number of juvenile arrests occurred in the 17 year old category with 90 persons arrested for 33%.

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\* Motor Vehicle Theft rate is based on number of vehicles registered by the Motor Vehicle and License Division, in 1980.

Forty percent of the juveniles arrested were below the legal age to lawfully operate a motor vehicle. There was one juvenile arrested in the 10 and Under age group, 4 in the 11-12 group, 44 arrests in the 13-14 age group and 59 in the 15 year category. Fifty-two percent of the juveniles arrested for motor vehicle theft were white males. Forty-one percent of the juveniles were black males. White females made up 6% of the arrests and black females, 1%.

#### Motor Vehicle Theft by Type

Motor Vehicle Theft is broken down into automobiles, trucks and buses, and "other" vehicles.

There were 8,885 automobiles stolen last year with 1,726 cases cleared for a 19% clearance rate. Trucks and buses accounted for 1,928 thefts with 308 clearances for a 16% clearance rate. The "other" category includes snowmobiles, motorcycles, motor scooters, trailbikes, etc. There were 1,156 thefts reported in the "other" category with 172 clearances for a 15% clearance rate.

The dollar value resulting from locally stolen motor vehicles reached \$41,521,469. The value recovered was \$21,322,917 or 51%.

Motor Vehicles Recovered

It should be noted that a recovery involves locating stolen property; but, a recovery does not clear a crime. Even though the owner is reunited with his property a crime was committed and a suspect must be taken into custody to clear the offense.

The number of motor vehicles stolen locally and recovered locally was 4,793. The vehicles stolen locally but recovered in other jurisdictions was 1,922. The number of vehicles stolen in other jurisdictions but recovered locally was 1,451.



# **ARSON**

Arson - willful or malicious burning with or without intent to defraud, includes attempts.

\* \* \* \* \*

Prior to 1979, Arson was classified as a Part II Offense with only arrest data being collected for UCR purposes. Then, as a result of Congressional authorization\*, Arson was designated a Part I Offense thereby requiring law enforcement agencies to submit reported offenses, unfounded complaints, actual offenses, clearances, juvenile clearances, arson of uninhabited or abandoned structures and estimated value of property damage.

In 1980, a total of 1,106 incidents of arson were reported to Alabama's law enforcement agencies. It should be noted that the hierarchy rule does not apply to arson, which means that any offense(s) committed in conjunction with arson results in the most serious offense as well as the arson being reported to UCR.

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\* Title 28, Section 534, United States Code.

Reported arson was up 45% in 1980 over 1979. In 1980, a total of 1,106 arsons were reported as compared to 763 incidents reported in 1979. There were 237 arsons cleared in 1980 effecting a 21% clearance rate. Juveniles accounted for 6% of the clearances.

A total of 56 juveniles were arrested in 1980 for arson. Fifty-nine percent of the juveniles arrested were white males with 25% being black males. White females comprised 7% of the juvenile arrests and black females, 9%. The age group of 10 and Under effected 11% of the juvenile arrests with the 11 to 12 year olds comprising 13% of these arrests. The 13-14 year olds made up 16% of the juvenile arrests and the 15 year group made up 14% of the juvenile arson arrests. Sixteen year olds and seventeen year olds had 18% and 29% of the juvenile arrests, respectively.

There were 221 adults arrested in 1980 for arson related incidents. Forty-eight percent of these arrests were white males and 39% were black males, white females effected 5% of the adult arrests and black females, 8%. The age group responsible for most of the arson arrests was 25-29 with 18% of the arrests followed by 30-34 year olds, who effected 14% of the adult arson arrests.

In 16% of the reported arsons, the structures involved were uninhabited, abandoned, or not normally in use. The total estimated value of property damage in Alabama resulting

from arson in 1980 was \$11,050,745. This produces an average of \$9,992 per incident.

Structural units, mobile property and "other" are the classifications used in reporting arson. Sixty-eight percent of the reported arson in Alabama involved structural units; 23% involved mobile property, and the remaining 9% fell into the "other" category. Clearance data indicates that 27% of the arsons involving structural units were cleared with an 11% clearance rate for mobile property and a 6% clearance rate for the "other" category.

Single occupancy residences made up 56% of the structural arsons and 38% of the total reported arson in Alabama in 1980. Of the 420 single occupancy arsons, 115 were cleared for a 27% clearance rate; juvenile arrests cleared 6%. (The arson rate\* for single occupancy residences was 28.6 per 100,000 housing units. The arson rate is considerably higher for unoccupied or uninhabited structures, 409.1 per 100,000 unoccupied housing units.) The estimated value of property damage for single occupancy residences was \$3,304,072 for an average of \$7,867 per incident.

Other residences, which include apartments, dormitories, boarding houses, etc., made up 10% of the structural arson incidents. Of the 75 residential arsons, 27 were cleared for a clearance rate of 36%. Juveniles accounted for 5% of the clearances. (The arson rate for residential units other than single

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\*This arson rate is based on the number of housing units in Alabama as reported by the U. S. Census of Housing (1980).

occupancy dwellings was 5.1 per 100,000 housing units. The arson rate for uninhabited residential structures was much higher, 73.0 per 100,000 unoccupied structures.) The estimated value of property damage due to arson for other residential units was \$539,527 averaging \$7,194 per incident.

Fifty-eight of the reported arsons in Alabama in 1980 affected storage buildings such as barns, warehouses, garages, etc. This is 8% of the structural arsons and 5% of the total number of arsons reported to Alabama's law enforcement agencies. Twenty-two percent of these arsons were cleared with 7% being juvenile clearances. Fifteen, or 26%, of these arsons occurred in buildings which were unoccupied or abandoned. The property damage estimate for storage buildings was \$1,336,675 producing an average of \$23,046 per incident.

Industrial/manufacturing buildings experienced 1% of the structural arsons in 1980, reporting nine incidents. Four offenses were cleared for a 44% clearance rate. There was one instance of arson of an uninhabited structure. The estimated property damage totalled \$1,281,630 with an average of \$142,403 per incident.

One hundred fourteen incidents of arson were reported involving commercial establishments, i.e., restaurants, stores, offices, etc; this is 15% of the reported arson against structural units. Nineteen of these arsons were cleared for a 17% clearance rate. Juveniles accounted for 7% of the clear-

ances. In 4% of the incidents, the structure was uninhabited or not normally in use. Estimated property damage was \$2,135,745 producing an average per incident of \$18,735.

Community or public buildings such as schools, jails, churches, hospitals, etc., experienced 65 incidents for 9% of the reported structural arsons. Twenty-three of the 65 reported offenses were solved for a clearance rate of 35%. Juvenile arrests accounted for 25% of the clearances. The estimated property damage for public buildings was \$1,274,955 for an average per incident value of \$19,615.

There were 15 reported arsons which involved buildings other than those previously mentioned. These buildings include monuments, outbuildings, buildings under construction, etc. Thirteen percent of these arsons were cleared and they were cleared by juvenile arrests. Property damage is estimated at \$111,700 for an average of \$7,447 per incident.

All totalled, there were 756 reported incidents of arson involving structural units. Of the 756 arsons, 203 were cleared for a clearance rate of 27%; fifty-eight of the 203 clearances involved juveniles. In 121 incidents, the buildings were uninhabited, abandoned, or not normally in use. The total estimated property damage for structural units was \$9,984,304 with an average of \$13,207 per incident.

Twenty-three percent of the total reported arson in 1980 involved mobile property. For the purpose of reporting arson data, mobile property consists of motor vehicles and other

mobile property.

By UCR definition, motor vehicles include automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, etc. In 1980, there were 226 arsons reported involving motor vehicles. This was 88% of the arson against mobile property and 20% of all reported arson. Twenty-five of these offenses were cleared for an 11% clearance rate; juveniles accounted for less than 1% of the clearances. The arson rate\* was 7.5 arsons per 100,000 motor vehicles. Estimated property damage for motor vehicle arson was \$813,591 averaging \$3,600 per incident.

There were 31 reported incidents of arson of "other" mobile property. "Other" mobile property includes trailers, recreational vehicles, airplanes, boats, etc. Three offenses were cleared producing a 10% clearance rate. The estimated property damage was \$175,930 averaging \$5,675 per incident.

A total of 257 mobile property arsons were reported to law enforcement agencies in 1980. This is 23% of all reported arson. Twenty-eight of these incidents were cleared for an 11% clearance rate. Juvenile arrests cleared less than 1%. Estimated mobile property damage due to arson was estimated at \$989,521 for an average of \$3,850 per incident.

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\* Motor vehicle arson rate is based on the number of motor vehicle registrations for 1980 as reported by the Motor Vehicle and License Division, Alabama Department of Revenue.


The miscellaneous or "all other" category includes crops, timber, fences, signs, etc. In 1980, a total of 93 incidents were reported in this category. This is 8% of the total number of arson incidents known to law enforcement agencies in 1980. Six of these offenses were cleared for a 6% clearance rate; juvenile arrests accounted for 3% of the clearances. The estimated value of property destroyed in the "other property" category was \$76,920 for an average cost per incident of \$827.

In summary, there were 1,106 arsons reported to Alabama's law enforcement agencies in 1980. Arson experienced a 21% clearance rate with juveniles accounting for 6% of the clearances. All totalled, property damage from arson was estimated at \$11,050,745 for Alabama in 1980. An average cost per incident was estimated at \$9,992.

A clearance is a measure of law enforcement activity whereby enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody (an arrest) or when a crime is solved but no formal charges are brought against a suspect (clearance by exceptional means). The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of offenses and dividing that number into the number of clearances.

It is important to note that clearance data is reported on a monthly basis to UCR and, therefore, it is possible for an arrest made in one month to clear a crime committed in previous months or years.


# **STANDARD METROPOLITAN**

Standard Metropolitan Statistical Areas (SMSA) are comprised of a county or contiguous counties containing a central city of 50,000 residents or more.



A clearance is a measure of law enforcement activity whereby enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody (an arrest) or when a crime is solved but no formal charges are brought against a suspect (clearance by exceptional means). The clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of offenses and dividing that number into the number of clearances.

It is important to note that clearance data is reported on a monthly basis to UCR and, therefore, it is possible for an arrest made in one month to clear a crime committed in previous months or years.

## PART 2 ARREST DATA

Part II Offenses include crimes other than those defined as Part I Offenses. The nature of many Part II Offenses is such that they go undetected until an arrest is made; therefore, for UCR purposes, only arrest data is collected. Part II Offenses include:

- . Other Assaults - nonaggravated assaults.
- . Forgery and Counterfeiting - making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true, includes attempts.
- . Fraud - fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses.
- . Embezzlement - misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.
- . Stolen Property - buying, receiving and possessing stolen property, includes attempts.
- . Vandalism - willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of property without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control.
- . Weapons - all violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, includes attempts.

- . Prostitution and Commercialized Vice - sex offenses of a commercialized nature.
- . Sex Offenses (other than forcible rape, prostitution and commercialized vice) - statutory rape, offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, etc.
- . Narcotic Drug Laws - offenses relating to narcotics, i.e., possession, sale, use, growing, and manufacturing of narcotic drugs.
- . Gambling - promoting, permitting or engaging in illegal gambling.
- . Offenses Against the Family and Children - non-support, neglect, desertion, or abuse of family and children.
- . Driving Under the Influence - driving or operating any motor vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.
- . Liquor Laws - violations of state or local liquor laws.
- . Drunkenness - drunkenness or intoxication.
- . Disorderly conduct - breach of the peace.
- . Vagrancy - begging, loitering, etc.
- . All Other Offenses - all violations of state or local laws, excepting categories mentioned above, Part I Offenses and traffic violations

A total of 189,837 persons were arrested in Alabama last year for Part II Offenses. The arrest figure is up by 48% over 1979 when 127,963 persons were arrested on Part II charges. Ninety-six percent of those arrested in 1980 were adults and 4% were juveniles. Of the total number 55% were white males and 29% were black males. White females comprised 10% of the total and black females made up 6%.

The 25-29 age group accounted for 16% of the Part II Arrests with 30-34 year group accounting for 12%. In all but one of the Part II Offense categories, 25-29 year olds accounted for the greatest number of arrests. The 30-34 age group accounted for the majority of the arrests in the gambling category.

#### Liquor Laws Violations

Driving under the influence (DUI) resulted in 33,057 arrests with 98% of those arrested over 18. The 25-29 age group effected the majority of the adult arrests, 5,297 or 16%. Of the adults arrested for DUI, 67% were white males, 27% black males, 5% and 1% for white females and black females, respectively. Sixty-eight percent of the juveniles arrested for DUI were 17 year olds. Two percent of those arrested were 14 or under. There were 8 DUI arrests in the 10 and Under age group, 1 in the 11-12 year group, and 2 in the 13-14 age category. Ninety percent of the juveniles arrested for DUI were white males, black males accounted for 6% and white females 4% of the total juvenile arrests for DUI.

There were 11,277 arrests made for liquor law violations with 90% of the arrests being adults. These adult arrests show 68% were white males, 20% black males, 6% white females, and 6% black females. Juvenile arrests show 77% were white males, 8% black males, 14% white females, and black females, 1%.

In 1980, 36,102 persons were arrested for public drunkenness. Ninety-eight percent of those arrested were adults. Of the adult arrests, 69% were white males, 25% black males, 4% and 2% for white females and black females, respectively. Juvenile arrests show 81% were white males, 7% black males, 11% white females and 1% black females.

#### Drug Violations

There were 9,818 drug related arrests in 1980 comprising 5% of the Total Part II Arrests. Eighty-nine percent of those arrested on drug charges were adults with 80% of the adults arrested on possession charges. Marijuana sale and possession effected the greatest number of total drug arrests, 7,955 or 81%. The 25-29 age group accounted for 23% of the adult drug arrests. White males accounted for 59% of the adult drug arrests with black males comprising 29%. White females accounted for 8% and black females 4%.

There were 1078 juveniles arrested on drug related charges with 45% of the juveniles arrested being 17 year olds. Eighty-six percent of the juvenile drug arrests in 1980 were sale or possession of marijuana. There was one juvenile under 10 arrested for possession of marijuana. One juvenile 11-12 was arrested for marijuana sale and 8 arrested for possession. One 11-12 year old was arrested for possession of synthetic drugs.

Nine juveniles in the 13-14 group were arrested for marijuana sale and 73 for possession. Sixty-eight percent of the juvenile drug arrests were white males, 19% were black males. White females accounted for 12% of the drug arrests and black females, 1%.

# **LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS**

## **KILLED OR ASSAULTED**

### Killed in Action

In 1980, five law enforcement officers lost their lives in the line of duty. Eighty percent of these homicides were cleared by arrest.

### Accident or Negligence

One officer was killed in a traffic related fatality. The other incident involved a gun misfiring. Both incidents were cleared.

### Felonious Act

Three police officers were killed in 1980 while performing their duties as peace officers.

One officer was killed while giving a speeding ticket; another officer was killed while stopping a suspicious vehicle. Both of these incidents were cleared. The third incident involved a police officer shot and killed by a sniper. This incident has not been solved.

### Assaulted

In 1980, a total of 392 law enforcement officers were assaulted in the line of duty. Seventy, or 18%, of these officers received serious injury. The remainder received no injury or minimal injuries.

#### Type of Activity by Weapons

Responding to disturbance calls effected 31% of the assaults on law enforcement officers. Attempting other arrests resulted in 24%. In both of these activities, personal weapons such as hands, fists, feet, etc., were the most common weapon type. Seventy-five percent of the officers assaulted while responding to disturbance calls were perpetrated by personal weapons.

Eighty-two percent of the assaults while attempting other arrests were perpetrated by personal weapons.

Other high risk activities include handling and transporting prisoners which resulted in 17% of the assaults. Traffic violations and/or mishaps effected 12% of the assaults. Again, personal weapons resulted in the majority of these assaults, 91% and 81%, respectively.

Eighty percent of the assaults on police officers involved hands, fists, feet, etc., with 84% receiving minimal or no injury. Firearms accounted for 11% of the assaults with 76% receiving no injuries. Cutting instruments were used in 3% of the assaults and other weapons in 6%. Records indicate that 85% of the assaults resulting from cutting instruments and 68% from other weapons involved minimal or no injury to the officer.

### Clearances for Assaults on Law Enforcement Officers

Eighty-six percent of the assaults on law enforcement officers in 1980 were cleared.

Officers assaulted during civil disorders and by a mentally deranged person each had 100% clearance rates. Officers assaulted while attempting other arrests effected a 92% clearance rate.

Eighty-nine percent of the assaults resulting from disturbance calls were cleared while 87% of the assaults occurring when handling or transporting prisoners were cleared. The following table depicts the number of clearances and clearance rate by activity type.

# GLOSSARY

Adult - the UCR system defines adults as 18 years of age and over.

Arrests - a measure of law enforcement activity by which an individual is detained in legal custody

Arson - willful or malicious burning with or without intent to defraud, includes attempts. (Through a Congressional mandate, 1979 was the first year arson was counted as a Part I Offense.) Arson is divided into the following categories:

- . Structural

Single occupancy residential - houses, townhouses, duplexes, etc.

Other residential - apartments, tenements, hotels, motels, dormitories, boarding houses, etc.

Storage - barns, garages, warehouses, etc.

Industrial/manufacturing.

Other commercial - stores, restaurants, offices, etc.

Community/public - churches, jails, schools, colleges, hospitals, etc.

All other structures - outbuildings, monuments, buildings construction, etc.

Arson - (continued)

. Mobile

Motor vehicles - automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, etc. Other mobile property - trailers, recreational vehicles, airplanes, boats, etc.

. Other - crops, timber, fences, signs, etc.

Assault - the unlawful attack by one person upon another for the purpose of inflicting severe bodily injury, including attempts. Attempted homicide is listed as an assault.

Burglary - unlawful entry of a structure to commit a felony or a theft.

Central city - a city with at least 50,000 residents.

City strata - a breakdown of cities according to population.

Clearance - a measure of law enforcement activity by which (1) enough evidence is found to charge a suspect and take him into custody or (2) by exceptional means which provides a solution to a crime without formal charges being brought against a suspect. It is possible for one arrest to clear more than one offense or for several arrests to clear one offense.

Clearance rate - the clearance rate is achieved by taking the number of clearances over the number of crimes reported.

Crime rate - a measure of criminal activity which shows the number of crimes reported per 100,000 residents.

Criminal activity - measured by reported crimes, trends, rates.

Forcible entry - offenses in which force of any kind is used to unlawfully enter a structure for the purpose of committing a theft or a felony.

Hierarchy of offenses - whenever more than one offense is committed simultaneously, the most severe offense is reported to UCR.

Homicide - the willful killing of another as based on police investigation.

Incident-Based Reporting System - a voluntary crime reporting system developed by ACJIC as an alternative to the UCR Summary.

Juveniles - the UCR system defines juveniles as males and females 17 years of age and younger.

Larceny - unlawful taking or stealing of property or articles without the use of force, violence or fraud, i.e., pocket picking, purse snatching, shoplifting, coin operated machines, etc.

Law enforcement activity - police activity as measured by clearances and arrests.

Minimal injury - personal injury involving abrasions, minor lacerations requiring no more than usual first-aid treatment.

Motor vehicles - automobiles, trucks, buses, motorcycles, etc.

Motor vehicle theft - unlawful taking or stealing of a motor vehicle, including attempts.

Non-residence - any structure used for purposes other than a residence.

Part I Index Crimes - a category of UCR offenses deemed more serious and/or most frequent. These Part I Index Crimes include homicide, rape, robbery, assault, burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

Part II Offenses - a category of UCR offenses which include:

- . Other assaults - non-aggravated assaults.
- . Forgery and counterfeiting - making, altering, uttering, or possessing with intent to defraud, anything false which is made to appear true, includes attempts.
- . Fraud - fraudulent conversion and obtaining money or property by false pretenses.
- . Embezzlement - misappropriation or misapplication of money or property entrusted to one's care, custody, or control.
- . Stolen property - buying, receiving, and possessing stolen property, includes attempts.
- . Vandalism - willful or malicious destruction, injury, disfigurement or defacement of property without the consent of the owner or person having custody or control.
- . Weapons - all violations of regulations or statutes controlling the carrying, using, possessing, furnishing and manufacturing of deadly weapons or silencers, includes attempts.
- . Prostitution and commercialized vice - sex offenses of a commercialized nature.

- . Sex offenses (other than rape, prostitution, and commercialized vice) - statutory rape, offenses against chastity, common decency, morals, etc.
- . Narcotic drug laws - offenses relating to narcotics, i.e., possession, sale, use, growing and manufacturing of narcotic drugs.
- . Gambling - promoting, permitting, or engaging in illegal gambling.
- . Offenses against the family and children - non-support, neglect, desertion, or abuse of family and children.
- . Driving under the influence - driving or operating any motor vehicle or common carrier while drunk or under the influence of liquor or narcotics.
- . Liquor laws - violations of state or local liquor laws.
- . Drunkenness - drunkenness or intoxication.
- . Disorderly conduct - breach of the peace.
- . Vagrancy - begging, loitering, etc.
- . All other offenses - all violations of state or local laws, excepting categories mentioned above, Part I Offenses, and traffic violations.

Property crimes - (non-violent crimes) index crimes which lack the aspect of force and/or bodily harm to the victim(s). Included in this category are burglary, larceny, motor vehicle theft, and arson.

Recovery - Finding stolen property. It should be noted that a recovered article does not clear a crime, although the owner is reunited with his property a crime was committed and a suspect must be taken into custody to clear the offense.

Reported crimes - crimes reported to law enforcement officials.

NOTE: In this report, only those offenses which prove to be actual offenses are used. Those cases which have been deemed unfounded are excluded from the crime totals. (It should be mentioned that a change in reporting on the part of victims can effect an increase or a decrease for certain crimes.)

Residence - any dwelling structure used for human habitation.

Robbery - stealing or taking anything of value from the care, custody, or control of a person, in his presence, by force or by threat of force, including attempts. Robbery is broken down into seven categories:

- . Highway - robberies occurring on the streets, in alleys outside of structures.
- . Commercial house - hotels, motels, lodging houses, loan companies.
- . Gas or service stations - sell gasoline and related products.
- . Convenience stores - neighborhood stores which specialize in the sale of consumable items.

- . Banking establishments - banks, savings & loan institutions, credit unions, etc.
- . Miscellaneous - churches, temples, schools, union halls, government buildings, public transit systems, etc.

Serious injury - personal injury is considered serious if there are broken bones, internal injuries, or if stitches are required.

Standard metropolitan statistical area (SMSA) - is a county or contiguous counties which contain at least one city of 50,000 inhabitants or more, or "twin cities" with a combined population of at least 50,000.

Uniform Crime Reports - standardized reporting forms used by law enforcement officials to report criminal activity within their jurisdiction.

Uniform Crime Reporting System - is the depository of the Uniform Crime Reports and Incident reporting forms and provides for the collection and dissemination of crime data.

Unlawful entry - involves no force and is achieved by use of an unlocked door or window. The element of trespass is essential.

Urbanized areas - incorporated or unincorporated places of 2500 or more inhabitants.

Violent crimes - (person crimes) index crimes which are offenses perpetrated against a person (or persons) with a high risk of injury or death to the victim. Crimes included in this category are homicide, rape, robbery, and assault.
